Testimony of Matson Navigation Company, Inc. Comments on HB1689, HD1 Before the Committee on Consumer Protection and Commerce March 2, 2022

Dear Chair Johanson, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and Members of the Committee,

Matson Navigation Company, Inc. (Matson) provides comments on HB1689, SD1, which requires shippers of fireworks or articles pyrotechnic to report certain information to applicable county fire departments; and authorizes county fire departments to enter shippers' vessels for the purpose of inspecting any shipment declared on the shipping manifest as fireworks or articles pyrotechnic.

This measure proposes to add additional reporting requirements to fire departments. Matson believes this is unnecessary because section 132D-8.6(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, already requires licensed importers, wholesalers, and retailers of fireworks or articles pyrotechnic ("licensee") to notify a county fire department of shipments of such shipments. Specifically, section 132D-8.6(a)(4) requires that prior to booking the shipment, the licensee shall provide to the applicable county fire chief (A) written documentation regarding the proposed display event or events and related contact information to allow the fire chief to validate the importation of a three-month or six-month inventory under section 132D-8.5; and (B) an inventory breakdown for each proposed display. Section 132D-8.6(a)(5) requires at the time shipping is booked, the shipper or consignee notifies the appropriate county official as determined by the county in writing of the expected shipment's landing date. As a shipper, Matson receives the same information that the licensees are already required to report to the county fire departments and does not have additional information. Imposing additional notification requirements on interstate shippers would result in providing duplicative information to the county fire departments.

This measure also proposes authorizing a county fire department to enter a vessel for the purpose of inspecting any shipment declared on the shipping manifest as fireworks or articles pyrotechnic. Again, Matson believes this provision is also unnecessary because section 132D-8.6(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, clearly authorizes county fire departments to conduct inspections of fireworks. Section 132D-8.6(b) states: "The fire department of a county, in which a shipment of fireworks or articles pyrotechnic has landed and becomes subject to the jurisdiction of the fire department, shall be allowed to inspect, if it chooses, any shipment declared on the shipping manifest as fireworks or articles pyrotechnic."

Should your Committee choose to advance this bill, for purposes of practicality and to avoid severely impeding the flow of commerce into the State, Matson requests you amend the measure to require that the inspection point for shipping containers be done at their final destination.

Hawaii news media reports injuries from fireworks misuse to adults and children every New Year's Eve. An adult male who lived on Kauai succumbed to fatal injuries sustained from a fireworks explosion on December 31, 2020. The elimination or reduction of illegal fireworks would reduce the number of emergency response calls due to fires and injuries, thereby allowing fire, police, and emergency medical services to be available for other important emergency incidents. We also believe the inspection of shipping containers will help reduce the number of fires and injuries related to fireworks misuse.

HB 1689 will allow the counties to increase their scrutiny over the multimodal transportation of fireworks. The report of the illegal fireworks task force to the legislature for the 2011 Regular Session, which was prepared in accordance with Act 170, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, recommended giving

county agencies the authority to inspect cargo containers at the harbors and other areas where cargo is unloaded. We would request careful consideration of the county fire department employees' legal authority to have open access to shipping containers containing fireworks. Aloha Chair Johanson, Vice Chair Kitagawa and Committee Members,

On behalf of the Hawaiian Humane Society, thank you for considering our support for House Bill 1689, HD1, which requires shippers that know that their cargo will include fireworks or articles pyrotechnic to report certain information to applicable county fire departments. Authorizes county fire departments to enter shippers' vessels for the purpose of inspecting any shipment declared on the shipping manifest as fireworks or articles pyrotechnic.

Hawaiian Humane supports any attempt to remove fireworks from residential neighborhoods by keeping these dangerous products out of our state entirely and/or enhancing enforcement. At what should be joyous times for local families, illegal fireworks fill our neighborhoods with unexpected explosions that terrorize pets and people alike.

Animals who flee their homes in fear are at enormous risk of injury and death. An average of 8 stray dogs per day came into the Hawaiian Humane Society in 2021. As the new year arrived, that number spiked to 36 between Jan. 1-2. Hawaiian Humane has long educated our community about keeping pets safe from the terror of fireworks around New Years and July 4, but these bombs increasingly go off for months at a time. That makes it impossible for pet owners to prepare and creates sustained stress on people and animals, which can do lasting damage to their emotional and physical health. Neither people nor animals should have to take tranquilizers just to survive the impacts of illegal behavior by their neighbors.

We urge the committee to pass this measure. Mahalo for your consideration.

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE HAWAII CONGRESSIONAL AND LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATIVES TO REQUEST ASSISTANCE FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO EMPLOY THEIR RESOURCES TO STOP TONS OF ILLEGAL AERIAL FIREWORKS EXPLOSIVES BEING TRANSPORTED TO HAWAII

WHEREAS, several Hawaii residents have complained about illegal aerial fireworks that are negatively impacting their daily lives with bad actor neighbors and individuals launching low altitude extremely loud aerial bomb firework explosions at all hours of the day, all year around and primarily targeting neighborhoods late evenings while people are resting or at sleep, and

WHEREAS, bad actor individuals have modified illegal fireworks into Improvised Explosive Devices (IED) such as pipe bombs to create a much greater low altitude or ground extremely loud explosions which severely impacted the health and safety of the elderly in care homes, disabled Vets with PTSD, children and family pets with some running away from home and being hit by vehicles, and

WHEREAS, the State Legislature previously took action on illegal aerial fireworks with increasing fines and developing a task force in the year 2010 comprised of the Federal Government representatives from ATF, U.S Customs, U.S. Coast Guard, HPD, HFD and port facilities commercial shipping companies; however, this task force did not produce results or any interdiction of illegal fireworks at our port facilities due to the excuse of inspectors claiming there are too many containers to be inspected and the community perception of possible corruption with inspectors, and

WHEREAS, the Honolulu Police Department is overwhelmed with the number of 911 calls that come in all year round and especially for New Years celebrations but the current law requires police officers to actually witness bad actor neighbors and individuals lighting the fuse of illegal fire works before any citation can be initiated or any further City prosecution which is not realistic for arresting the bad actors, and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government such as ATF, FBI and Customs and Border Protection have the classified resources, technology and capabilities to identify, track, interdict and prosecute individuals involved in trans-national organized crime rings transporting and selling tons of explosive illegal aerial fireworks between China and the U.S., which support bad actor residents terrorizing Hawaii neighborhoods, and

WHEREAS, it is suspected by the community and others that the bulk of illegal fireworks are produced in Liuyang, China, transported to Shanghai where the product is loaded into shipping containers and onto Chinese cargo merchant vessels bound for Los Angeles where the product is suspect to be transited by ground to other destinations where the product is then placed into Trojan Horse non-declared explosive shipping containers disguised as high priority goods which are then shipped to major U.S. mainland cities and Hawaii, and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government agencies have the capability to track containers and those suspect containers could be inspected at Honolulu Ports by Federal Agents with trained sniffing dogs or technology devices previously used in the Middle East for detecting explosive material and IEDs, and

WHEREAS, deceptive shipping containers arrive in Hawaii, usually by October each year base on a spike in use of illegal aerial bomb fireworks and this material is temporary stored in commercial warehouses and neighborhood communities and it is only a matter of time where there could be a fireworks accident in this storage area blowing up a city block or residential neighborhood taking many lives of our residents, and

BE IT RESOLVED that the Pearl City Neighborhood Board is requesting our State Legislators and Congressional Representatives to request assistance from the Federal Government to employ their resources to stop illegal fireworks from entering Hawaii ports and to collect evidence for prosecution for all involved in the shipping and storage process to

include bad actor local government employees involved in the distribution of illegal fireworks that should be charged with Class "A" felonies and loss of retirement pensions, and

BE IT RESOLVED that the Pearl City Neighborhood Board requests the State Legislature to improve current illegal fireworks and explosive laws to increase fines and coordinate with the City and County of Honolulu and Judicial authority to develop a monetary reward amount to solicit information from residents on locations of storage of illegal fireworks in warehouses and residential areas to help mitigate this serious safety situation in our neighborhoods and commercial areas; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Pearl City Neighborhood Board requests that Hawaii District Court improve the timeliness for neighborhood residents to litigate potential law suits against bad actor neighbors and individuals to collect punitive damages for the terroristic loud explosions gravely impacting the health and safety of their families and pets with the use of eye witnesses reports coupled with video evidence, signed affidavits by neighbors and HPD police reports for each terroristic loud explosion event that will support the civil suit and possibly lead to criminal prosecution, and
