#### RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

Chairs Ichiyama and Tarnas, Vice Chairs Poepoe and Takayama, and members of the Committees. The Hawai'i Community Development Authority (HCDA) supports **HB 2361**, that authorizes the HCDA to render services to and assist state and county agencies upon request.

HCDA recognizes that state agencies have a need for additional infrastructure or facilities to effectively implement their legislative mandate and would like to utilize its experience and knowledge in master planning communities, infrastructure development and improvement, and project management to assist other state and county agencies on projects within and outside of designated community development districts.

This is a housekeeping measure, HCDA has been assisting other agencies.

HCDA is assisting the Department of Public Safety (PSD) in expanding its existing kitchen facilities at the Women's Community Correctional Center to accommodate a culinary program for the women, in partnership with the Kapiolani Community College, in an effort to reduce recidivism.

HCDA is also assisting the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) in preparing a preliminary site assessment and strategic market outlook study for the Waiākea Peninsula, also known as Banyan Drive in Hilo.
