The Office of the Auditor offers comments on H.C.R. No. 137 and H.R. No. 138, requesting the auditor to conduct an audit on the Department of Transportation's Pali Highway resurfacing. Specifically, the resolutions request the auditor to conduct and submit a performance audit of the Department of Transportation's Pali Highway resurfacing.

Performance audits examine the efficiency and effectiveness of a state program by assessing the program's activities against statutory and other criteria. Generally, program management is responsible for developing and implementing policies, procedures, and other internal controls to help ensure the program achieves its statutory purpose. An audit assesses, among other things, those policies, procedures, and controls as well as whether the program's actual activities are being performed consistent with them. The Office of the Auditor conducts performance audits in accordance with government auditing standards issued by the U.S. Comptroller General.

While we appreciate Legislators want to provide residents with timely information on the status of the project, we believe the questions asked in the resolution can best be answered directly by the department or agency. The work described in the resolutions, however, is not an audit.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in <u>STRONG SUPPORT</u> of HR 138. As a taxpayer who uses the Pali Hwy. daily, I am beyond frustrated at the slow and piecemeal progress of the DOT's improvements to this thoroughfare.

It has been 6 years since this project was initiated. The public deserves to know what is going on and why the work is not be making acceptable progress. It is 3 years past its' estimated completion date.

Daytime commuters often have no warning that one lane will be closed, resulting in long delays. I have no choice but to leave 30 minutes early for appointments as it's always a possibility that bottlenecks will await.

My husband rides a motorcycle, and the extreme unevenness of the curbing and the asphalt is very dangerous for a 2-wheeled vehicle. Oftentimes, signage regarding the unevenness is posted days after the unsafe paving is created.

Also, the large traffic signal poles installed in the middle of sidewalks appear to block sidewalk clearance for wheelchairs.

Again, as taxpayers, we have a right to know why this project remains a thorn in our sides so many years after its' expected completion date.
