S.B. No. 2792 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS. LCA, WAM

The Hawaii Fire Fighters Association (HFFA), Local 1463, IAFF, AFL-CIO, represents more than 1,900 professional active-duty fire fighters throughout the State. The HFFA, on behalf of all of our members, **strongly supports S.B. No. 2792** which provides for collective bargaining cost items for the members of Unit 11, including the cost of salary adjustments negotiated between the State and HFFA for fiscal biennium 2021-2023. As you know, HFFA members provide fire protection and life safety services at the Airports throughout the State of Hawaii.

The Interest Arbitration proceedings concluded on January 14, 2022 and the three-member panel is expected to issue its final and binding decision in late March.
