The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT) **supports** SB 3221,SD1, which appropriates funds to support international sister-state relations and offers the following comments:

- Hawaii's sister-state relationships serve to raise Hawaii's profile internationally, attract dynamic cooperative programs such as mutual exchanges in business, culture, tourism and education that positively impact Hawaii's economic growth.

RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL SISTER-STATE RELATIONS

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

Senate Bill No. 3321, S.D. 1, appropriates \$200,000 in general funds for FY 23 to the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism's (DBEDT) Business Development and Support Division (BDSD), program ID BED 100.

B&F notes that Act 88, SLH 2021, already appropriates \$100,000 in federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act funds to DBEDT-BDSD for International Sister-State Relations in FY 22 and FY 23, of which FY 22's amount has already been released.

B&F further notes that, with respect to the general fund appropriation in this bill, the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act requires that states receiving Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) II funds and Governor's Emergency Education Relief II funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and

- Higher education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

Further, the federal ARP Act requires that states receiving ARP ESSER funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

The U.S. Department of Education has issued rules governing how these maintenance of effort (MOE) requirements are to be administered. B&F will be working with the money committees of the Legislature to ensure that the State of Hawai'i complies with these ESSER MOE requirements.

My name is Reyna Kaneko, President of the Japan-America Society of Hawai'i (JASH). JASH was founded in 1976 to promote understanding and friendship between the people of Japan and the United States through the special and unique perspective of Hawaii.

JASH **strongly supports** SB3221, SD1 which appropriates funds to support international sister-state relations. Hawai'i's sister-states play an important role in the economic, cultural and educational advancement between Hawai'i, foreign governments and non-governmental organizations. In so doing, Hawai'i residents, students, businesses, and NGOs have unique opportunities to develop relationships and partner with a varied range of countries, including China, Japan, India, Indonesia, Korea, Morocco, Philippines, Portugal and Taiwan.

Throughout the years, JASH has conducted numerous events, seminars, educational missions and visits with many of the sister-state provinces and prefectures of Japan, including Fukuoka, Okinawa, Hiroshima, Ehime and Hokkaido.

In 2023, JASH will be hosting a Hawai'i-Japan Sister Convention which will include the State of Hawai'i's sister states, as well as the sister cities of the counties of Hawai'i, Oahu, Kauai and Maui.
