The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT) offers the following comments on SCR 22/SR 16, which is requesting the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to conduct a study on the "Made in Hawaii" and "Hawaii Made" brands and prepare a plan to encourage and enforce the use of those brands.

During last year's legislative session, \$150,000 was appropriated from ARPA funds to promote the "Hawaii Made" brand. A Request for Proposal was issued in January 2022, requesting services to conduct a study and to develop the brand. The RFP, however, did not yield any response. A revised Request for Proposal was again issued in March 2022, with a response due date in April.
