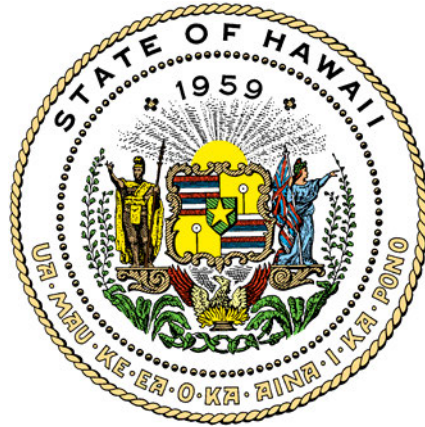

II. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

Adaptive Hawaii is a Maui based company committed to making the island and outdoor recreation more accessible. We work with tourism partners to offer accessible services, offer accessibility training services in the hospitality industry as well as concierge services to visitors with disabilities. With the proceeds from these endeavors, we host adaptive recreation events in the community and work to support adaptive athletes on Maui. Since 2018 Adaptive Hawaii has been helping the Maui Hawaii Surf Association to host adaptive division heats in their local contests as well as local adaptive surfers to grow their skill sets and achieve their dreams. .

In 2022, as part of our mission to empower adaptive athletes, Adaptive Hawaii began to manage and sponsor the Hawaii Adaptive Surf Team.

The Hawaii Adaptive Surf Team (HAST) originated in 2015 with 11 members from the islands of Kauai, Oahu, and Hawaii. The team works to bring together Hawaii's top adaptive surfers to compete locally leading up to state and national championships and then the international world championships run by the international surfing association (ISA) each year.

The team now consists of surfers from all counties in Hawaii. The world competition team is limited to 22 individuals, but the HAST helps support all adaptive surfers interested in competition. The future of HAST looks to build on our successes through broader recruitment, expanded organization, and increased participation, particularly for women and young people, in international surfing competitions including the paralympics.

The 2022 ISA World Parasurf Championships was held December 4-11 2022. Over 28 nations were represented with over 180 surfers. The ISA has been tirelessly advocating for the inclusion of adaptive surfing in the 2028 L.A. Paralympic games. At the end of January, the official announcement will be made about its inclusion. Regardless of the date of inclusion of surfing into the Paralympic games, the goal of the HAST is to ensure that there are as many surfers as possible representing the nation of Hawaii on team USA during the Paralympics.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

Goal

The goal of this funding request is to help grow and strengthen the capacity of the Hawaii Adaptive Surf Team to compete on the world stage at the highest possible levels, representing the Nation of Hawaii and bringing notice to the sport of Adaptive surfing both in Hawaii and internationally.

In order for the team to operate at its highest level, financial support is needed to cover costs such as administrative management, travel, coaching and equipment.

In addition to getting the team to World Championships, the HAST is committed to increasing the number of women participating in and competing in adaptive surfing.

There is currently a significant imbalance of men to women in adaptive surfing. With this funding, we will give training funding priority to women who want to begin or continue to excel in competing at the international level for team Hawaii.

Our objectives in reaching this goal are to:

- Hire a team manager to help build the capacity of the team and organize logistics for competition.
- Increase partner sponsors and sustainable funding opportunities
- Create a comprehensive HAST athlete policy guide
- Increase training and coach opportunities for athletes, particularly women

- Cover travel cost for the team and their support for the 2023 ISA World Parasurf Championships

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

Surfing was just included in the 2020 Olympics for the very first time. The International Surfing Organization (ISA) has been hard at work to get this inclusion by the International Olympic Committee. In 2020, all of Hawaii was inspired by Carissa Moore taking the gold medal for team USA but also for the nation of Hawaii. The opportunity is close at hand for our athletes living with disabilities as well. The ISA is currently working tirelessly to also have adaptive surf included in the 2028 paralympic games.

Para surfing is a fast growing sport. The 2022 World Championships saw 24 countries and 180 athletes participate, the largest number to date. Each year, more and more athletes from various nations join their national teams to compete at the highest levels. In order for our team to represent the nation of Hawaii at their best, we need support from the community and the state.

Para surfing is impactful to every person who participates. Far more than just the athletes themselves benefit, everyone from support team to spectators can feel the stoke and aloha of adaptive surfing. In order for Hawaii to continue to be a leader in the sport of surfing, we need support for our athletes.

Through the visibility of adaptive surfing, adults and children with disabilities are given a platform to be seen as more than just their disability. This visibility increases accessibility awareness in our communities, inspires other people with disabilities to pursue their dreams and creates a larger culture of awareness around disability and access. These athletes are redefining what it means to have a disability. The whole community benefits when we magnify their stories and accomplishments.

4. Describe the target population to be served

The target population served through this grant request is the 22 disabled surfers and their support crew who will be representing the nation of Hawaii at the world parasurf championships in 2023 and beyond. Because of the organizational capacity building aspect to our request, this grant will impact teams for years to come.

While these surfers will be the direct beneficiaries, the entire nation of Hawaii will be represented and inspired. The effect of participating in and spectating adaptive surfing is tremendous on the entire community. The team is requesting support so that the message and mission of this team may be amplified.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

Surfers on the HAST come from all over Hawaii including all 5 major counties. Coverage of this event is international, with live broadcasting across the world during the competition. Team training will be held on Maui and Oahu. World Championship competition for 2023 will be held in Pismo Beach, California

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

The HAST is requesting funding to hire a team manager. This manager would be hired by and report to the HAST advisory committee. This three person committee is composed of athletes and sponsor stakeholders in the team. The HAST advisory committee will advertise and accept applications for this role from June to July. Interviews will be conducted in early July with a goal of selecting the team manager by the end of July 2023.

The tasks and responsibilities of each of our objectives are listed below:

- Hire a team manager to help build the capacity of the team and organize logistics for competition.
 - The team manager will work 15 hr per week for a contract total of 48 weeks.
 - The responsibilities of the team manager will include accomplishing the remaining objectives of this grant including but not limited to creating and implementing a policy manual, establishing and growing strategic funding partnerships, social media management, coaching management and team travel management.
- Increase partner sponsors and sustainable funding opportunities
 - In 2022 the HAST raised \$7,820 through community donations and \$2000 in company sponsorships.
 - The fundraising goal for the newly hired manager will be to increase these numbers by 25% for the 2023 and 2024 competitive seasons.
 - Increasing user engagement on social media and establishing opportunities for community collaboration with both businesses and individuals
- Create a comprehensive HAST athlete policy guide
 - This guide will include policy and procedures to address athlete complaints, misconduct, team qualification process and safe sport policies.
 - Each season, the manager will distribute athlete and volunteer feedback forms and create a report, taking the outcomes into consideration for the next season planning

- Increase training and coach opportunities for athletes, particularly women.
 - The HAST, under the coordination of the team manager will host at least two in person training and recruiting events prior to the 2023 World Championship competition
 - The HAST, under the coordination of the team manager, will host at least three additional training and recruiting events prior to the 2024 World Championship competition.
 - Active recruiting consists of advertising and word of mouth communications with agencies and organizations who work with people with disabilities to create opportunities for those who may want to compete in adaptive surfing to train with the team.
 - A budget of \$2000 has been requested for interisland flights to help cover travel costs for surfers on outer island.
 - A new aspect of training for the 2023 season will be on land training, both virtually and in person. The design and implementation of this innovative new program designed for various disabilities will be \$1500.
 - In-water coaching has a set budget of \$3000 to include video feedback and a total of 5 recruiting and coaching sessions for the 2023 and 2024 seasons.
 - Coaches will be identified and chosen by the HAST advisory committee and hired as contractors.
- Cover travel cost for the team and their support for the 2023 ISA World Parasurf Championships
 - A budget of \$2500 for each of the 22 athletes has been requested to assist in travel and accommodation assistance for the 2023 World Para surf championships. Each athlete will need to raise additional funds to cover costs above this number. In 2022, the average travel cost of each athlete, not including support, was about \$4500.
 - Athletes will work alongside the team manager to raise the additional funds from community fundraising and strategic partnerships.
 - A request of \$2500 per team assistant was requested for 3 support crew, including the Team manager, Coach, and head of water support.
 - Team uniform design and printing for the entire HAST team and support is about 50 shirts. The budget set for the 2023 season is \$3000

As part of our general team development, the team manager will update our current athlete manual with best practices and policies including safe sport and complaint resolution procedures and guidelines. Procedures will be put in place officially for addressing athlete concerns, measuring success and athlete qualification processes. After each season, the team and supporters will be sent an anonymous feedback survey to ensure that any athlete concerns or issues are resolved or improved each year.

In January 2024, a report will be completed consisting of updates based upon objectives and measuring growth of these area:

- Effectiveness of team manager at building capacity
- Percentage increase of partner sponsors and sustainable funding opportunities
- The comprehensive HAST athlete policy guide
- Percentage increase of training and coach opportunities for athletes, particularly women
- Report on costs associated with the world parasurf championships
- Athlete and team performance results
- Feedback from team athletes on the 2023 season

In February 2024, a new competition year plan will be put in place with improvements from data collected in the 2023 year.

At the close of this grant cycle, both reports will be presented to the expending agency.

In 2022, due to limited funding, the team size was a meager 6 surfers out of 22 spots. Even with this small team, Hawaii placed 10th in the world. In past competitions, Hawaii has typically placed between 5th and 1st place. Our goal for 2023 is to have a robust team and find our way back into the top 5 nations in the world. At the end of this grant cycle, the HAST manager will present the new team policy and procedure handbook as well as national rankings of each athlete and the team as a whole. Our measures of success will be:

- Complete a comprehensive policy and procedure plan
- Bringing a team of at least 15 competitors to the world championships
- Creating at least 1 new funding partnership
- Hold 2 team coaching clinics in 2023
- Hold 3 team coaching clinics in 2024

The Hawaii Adaptive Surf Team has been a collaboration project in the community since 2015. With community partners such as Accessurf Hawaii, Kelea Foundation, Adaptive Hawaii, North Shore Prosthetics and surf coaches such as Rainos Hayes, Joel Centeio and Duran Barr coming together with athletes to increase opportunities for them to excel in competition. Since 2015, Accessurf and its partners have been helping to host adaptive heats in the Oahu HSA contest events, with over 30 competitions including adaptive surfers. On Maui, Adaptive Hawaii and Kelea Foundation have been working alongside HSA Maui since 2018 to host adaptive heats in several of their competitions with over 12 contests including adaptive surfers.

Adaptive Hawaii took over team management from Accessurf Hawaii in 2022 after working alongside them to help manage Maui athletes and competitions since 2017. Adaptive Hawaii immediately put in place an advisor committee of diverse stakeholders to help guide team decisions and policy. On a short timeline of only a few months, Adaptive Hawaii helped the small team raise almost \$8000 to help cover travel costs. Current, volunteer, team manager and owner of Adaptive Hawaii, Jenn Gladwin, has traveled with the team since 2017. She has experience with all aspects of the team from fundraising to team selections, competition rules, ISA procedure, sponsorship management and volunteer communications. Jenn, alongside the HAST Advisory committee will help choose an excellent manager with experience in surf team competition, fundraising and community outreach. This manager will perform all duties under the supervision and guidance of the HAST Advisory committee and Jenn Gladwin.

2. Facilities

The HAST team manager position will be a remote. Team coaching sessions will be at various beaches and accessibility will be insured by Adaptive Hawaii or other community partner equipment.

The hiring process will include:

- June-July 15th- Online Application Process
- July 15th-25th-Virtual Interviews Conducted
- July 30th- Final decision made by the HAST advisory committee

Manager skills needed will include:

- High proficiency in digital communication including, google office services, social media, zoom and other online communication platforms
- Ability to identify, pursue and secure strategic funding partnerships in all 5 major counties.
- Experience in fundraising administration
- Ability to manage and inspire a wide array of personalities with various communication types
- Strong Knowledge of accessibility and disability culture
- Experience working in the surf industry, adaptive surf preferred but not mandatory
- Understanding of surf competition rules and procedures
- Ability to create and implement appropriate policy guidelines and reports
- Strong writing and verbal communication skills.
- A vision and passion for growing the sport of adaptive surfing and team Hawaii
