A brief description of the applicant's background;

Haliimaile Pineaple Company (HPC) has operated the Maui Gold pineapple farm in Upcountry Maui since Maui Land & Pineapple Company (MLP) shut down its century-old pineapple plantation in 2009. In 2010, former MLP employees created HPC, which was acquired by a mainland company called the LeVecke Corporation in 2018. Most recently, a locally owned/operated business, Maui Pineapple Tour LLC acquired HPC on January 1, 2023.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

The goals and objectives related to this request are quite urgent and relate to installing fencing to prevent crop damage from Axis deer and feral pigs. The fencing project will be done in 3 main phases, the order of which was determined by assessing which fields have the highest priority and most urgent need of mitigation efforts.

Specifically, this request's objective is to install about 8,700 linear feet of Game and Ranch fencing in Phase 1 (out of a total of 30,067 linear feet needed for the full project).

Phase 1 is broken down into 1,270 linear feet of Ranch Fence (up to 6 feet in height) and 7,429 linear feet of Game Fence (8-10 feet in height) installed around the 5 highest priority fields in active pineapple cultivation. After these high-priority fields are secured, we will move into Phases 2 and 3 the project. Phases 2 and 3 will include the installation of an additional 8,512 and 13,156 linear feet of fencing, respectively.

Over the past 2-3 years, HPC has been inundated and devastated by herds of Axis deer coming into the farmland and destroying (eating and trampling) acres upon acres of planted crops. This issue, also exacerbated by the region's "historic drought", has resulted in \$1M-\$2M in losses per year.

Rather than investing in mitigation solutions (such as game fencing), this economic loss over several years led the LeVeckes Corporation's decision to shut down the farm altogether if another owner could not be found. Maui Pineapple Tours LLC acquired the farm on January 1, 2023 and is urgently implementing a multi-pronged approach in stemming losses to Axis deer and feral pig impacts, and stabilizing the agricultural harvest of Maui Gold pineapple.

The public purpose and need to be served;

Unfortunately, if the farm isn't able to prevent future damage from Axis deer and continues to lose crops at a rate consistent to the last 2-3 years, HPC will have to shut down as these economic losses are simply not financially viable from a business sense.

If the farm shuts down, the Maui community loses the only major grower (currently capable of producing over 200 tons of harvestable fruit every month) of the iconic Maui Gold pineapple. Although the direct sales of fruit averages around \$3M-\$4M annually, pineapple is an economic generator for more than just the farm. Many local businesses use Maui Gold pineapples (or juice) in their own products and services (such as MauiWine in Ulupalakua) or benefit from the farm anchoring the small Haliimaile community (such as the Haliimaile General Store restaurant).

Similarly, Maui Pineapple Tours is reliant on the farm operating normally, bringing in more than 41,000 visitors and tourists annually to learn about how pineapples grow and how the farm operations, as well as experience tasting fresh-cut Maui Gold directly in the field. These visitors often say that this is the best pineapple they've ever tasted. Participants are then much more likely to become long-term repeat customers of Maui Gold pineapple (often getting pineapples shipped to the mainland), as well as more likely to become consumers of other locally made products that incorporate Maui Gold pineapples. Interest in Agritourism is only expected to increase over the next few decades, and it benefits the Maui community to have diverse and unique options to offer visitors.

Closing the farm wouldn't just mean that the Maui community loses an additional 77 local, good-paying jobs tied to agriculture, it would mean the community loses an iconic and unique local agricultural product that is intertwined with Maui's culture and history for over a century. Maui Gold is famously one of the most delicious varieties of pineapple in the world, and many local people are exceptionally found of the fruit and many businesses proudly use Maui Gold pineapples in their restaurants and products.

It would be incredibly unfortunate to lose such an important agricultural product due to the lack of investment in high-impact, common-sense mitigation efforts such as fencing. HPC is now using a multi-prong approach including applying for HDOA's emergency loans for Axis deer impacts in Maui County, and working with the USDA's APHIS Wildlife Services Hawaii – but the need for grant assistance remains, especially during this first year of new ownership.

HPC is estimating that the full fencing project for all 30,067 linear feet will cost \$549,965. MCP is requesting assistance with \$100,000 via this grant request, or 18% of the total project's cost.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

The target population to be served are all local consumers and businesses who enjoy and have pride in the history, uniqueness and high-quality of Maui Gold variety of pineapple. Pineapple is an iconic symbol of Hawaii, but Maui Gold pineapple is iconic of Maui.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The main geographic area that would benefit would be Maui County, although Maui Gold pineapples are shipped nationally and have a world-wide appreciation.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

HPC will oversee the hiring of a General Contractor who specializes in Land Clearing and Game Fence installation. This contractor will be responsible for installing the appropriate fence around the specified agricultural fields in 3 Phases. Phase 1 will include the installation of 8,700 linear feet of fencing, Phase 2 will include the installation of 8,512 linear feet of fencing and Phase 3 will include the installation of 17,211 linear feet of fencing.

Phase 1 of the fencing project is the most urgent portion and is expected to be completed in Q1. Depending on funding secured, we are hoping that Phase 2 will be completed by Q2, land clearing and for Phase 3 will begin in Q3 and the entire project completed by Q4.

This project is vital for the long-term viability of HPC, so management will be working closely with the Contractor throughout the installation process to ensure the quality of the fencing materials and installation efforts. We will be able to monitor and evaluate effectiveness by observing additional crop damage, fence damage, or herds of deer.
