Magical Creatures Sanctuary is a farmed animal sanctuary on the Big Island of Hawaii that currently provides a safe haven to 90+ rescued residents. We are entirely volunteer run with 9 full-time, unpaid staff who all live on site and 20+

local volunteers who assist with all aspects of our work. Our mission is to rescue, rehabilitate, and offer life-long sanctuary to rescued animals while serving the local community with programs that promote kindness, compassion, and stewardship.

The goals and objectives related to the request;

The goal of the project is to add 6,649 ft of woven wire fencing to create seven new pastures providing a secure and safe environment for our programmatic work with both the community and the county government.

The public purpose and need to be served;

The improvements made possible by this grant would provide public benefit in several ways. The Sanctuary is frequently approached by local farm animal owners with questions and concerns about the health, diet, and care required for their animals. With this grant we would be able to offer learning and knowledge-sharing opportunities to Big Island residents and businesses that will allow them to provide optimal care for their animals. This could include sessions on proper pasture rotation schemes, hoof trimming, sheep shearing, medication administration, nutrition requirements, parasite control, and proper fencing techniques.

Magical Creatures is a long-time partner of Hawaii County Animal Control. We take in injured, abandoned, neglected, and special needs animals that the department encounters. We also provide quarantine and temporary boarding services for the agency. This is done at no cost to the county or state. With the grant, we would be able to take on even more work with Animal Control by offering additional safe and secure pastureland for the services we provide. The fencing project will allow for better pasture rotation and thus better parasite control.

Our Education & Outreach program serves Island residents and visitors by providing a better understanding of the need for stewardship of both the animals and the land. This grant will allow us to create more opportunities for educational interactions with local residents that help create a more sustainable Hawaii for future generations.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

The target population served includes local residents, local businesses, local animal populations (both domesticated and feral), tourists, and county Animal Control.

Describe the geographic coverage.

The geographic area served is the entirety of the Big Island. Our programs are accessible and utilized by audiences across the Island as well visitors to Hawaii Island.

Local volunteers along with Sanctuary staff will install the fencing per any applicable regulatory requirements.

The timeline for completion of the buildout will be 6 months from receipt of the grant money. Outcome measurement will begin immediately thereafter with initial reports at the one-year mark and subsequent reports at the two-year mark.

The Sanctuary has been incorporated since 2018 and has designed and completed multiple fencing projects on the initial 13-acre property. This work has been completed by Sanctuary staff utilizing extant skill and knowledge along with the support of local volunteers.

The Sanctuary operates on 35 acres of pastureland which includes the newly acquired 23-acre parcel that is the subject of the bulk of the new fencing. Protected storage is available for all parts and equipment that the grant will provide for.

She has also designed and implemented multiple fencing projects on the property. She gained significant knowledge of the work by initially working alongside experienced fencing professionals and has since completed projects on her own.

Mr. Hubers has decades of experience in organizational leadership as well as a background in general contracting.

We have local volunteers committed to the installation work with direct oversight by Ms. Lundblad and Mr. Hubers. There will thus be no labor cost for the project.
