The Queen's Health Systems is the largest private, nonprofit acute care medical facility in Hawaii, including four hospitals: Punchbowl Campus, West Oahu Campus, North Hawaii Campus, and Molokai Campus. We have 674 staffed beds between these sites. We also serve outpatient care in the same communities, including cardiovascular care through the Queen's Heart Institute.

Mission: To fulfill the intent of Queen Emma and King Kamehameha IV to provide, in perpetuity, quality healthcare services to improve the well-being of Native Hawaiians and all the People of Hawaii.

What we do: The Queen's Heart Institute of the Queen's Health Systems brings together board-certified, specialty-trained physicians and nurse practitioners to offer the most comprehensive cardiovascular in Hawaii. In addition, we are leaders in education and research, highlighted by our affiliation as the primary Cardiovascular Faculty for the John A. Burns School of Medicine.

As a part of our research and community commitment, faculty members of the Queen's Heart Institute have undertaken nationally recognized research into identifying the prevalence and characteristics of methamphetamine associated cardiomyopathy in the Islands of Hawaii.

When analyzing the last 10 years of ED presentations, we discovered that of approximately 40,000 patients presenting with a diagnosis of heart failure, nearly 8% (3000) patients were found to have methamphetamine associated cardiomyopathy. Our research has demonstrated that this phenomenon disproportionately affects Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders as well as homeless patients. They are higher utilizers of health care services, with almost double the number of ED visits than non-meth associated cardiomyopathy patients.

In collaboration with the Queen's Care Coalition, which has done outstanding work with this at risk population, our goal for this grant is to employ and train two Patient Community Navigators to achieve better health outcomes, including decreased ED utilization and improved outpatient continuity of care. The navigators will work primarily on the Western region of Oahu and within the Native Hawaiian community, both at hospital sites and in affected communities.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. The role of the Patient Community Navigator will involve two major key elements:

Community outreach:

- a. Support community health by establishing and maintaining trusting relationships with patients, families, and providers to promote health, recovery, resiliency, and wellness.
- b. Perform activities off-site, in the community, and make patient home visits as required.

Project oversight:

a. QHI and QCC shall jointly be responsible for oversight of the navigator's role, including development of both short term and long term goals working towards improving health outcomes of our target population.

The Patient Community Navigators will provide 30-90 days of services to patients who have a diagnosis of methamphetamine induced heart failure with priority for patients identifying as Native Hawaiian, those living within the West Oahu region, and patients with high emergency department and hospital utilization. The Patient Community Navigators will provide frequent check-ins with patients to connect them to community resources, such as housing/shelter, food, financial benefits, and will assist them with coordinating medical follow-up appointments and transportation. Upon graduation from the program, the Patient Community Navigators will provide a warm handoff to community supports to ensure that care is being continued.

- 2. The timeline shall be (notional and subject to change by the Hawaii State Legislature):
 - a. April 2023 Begin candidate selection process once notified of grant approval by Hawaii State Legislature.
 - b. June 2023 Complete candidate selection process.
 - July 2023 Commence Patient Community Navigator services focusing on improving health outcomes of selected patients affected by methamphetamine associated cardiomyopathy.
 - d. July 2024 Analyze health outcomes and health care utilization in our target population to evaluate the benefits of our Patient Community Navigator.
- Administrative leadership from both the Queen's Heart Institute and Queen's Care Coalition will conduct a formal assessment with the navigators once a quarter to ensure processes are intact to achieve the goals intended.
- 4. The measures of effectiveness for the role of Patient Community Navigator will be assessed by evaluating:
 - a. Did the Navigator effectively establish community relationship?
 - b. Did the Navigator help in increasing access to health care resources for the patients they are servicing?
 - c. Did the Navigator help in optimizing health outcomes in the target population, including decreased ED utilization, improved medication and clinic adherence?

V. Experience and Capability

1. Necessary Skills and Experience

Drs. Michael Brodsky and Isaac Mizrahi will lead the administrative responsibilities from the Queen's Heart Institute. Both Drs. Brodsky and Mizrahi are conducting population based research on how to best understand, treat, and prevent methamphetamine induced heart failure. In addition, Dr. Brodsky has

years of both clinical and administrative experience, including being a former Division Chief of Cardiovascular Diseases at UC-Irvine.

Dr. Dipanjan Banerjee, Director for the Queen's Heart Institute Center for Advanced Heart Failure will provide additional content expertise and resources. Dr. Zia Khan, Chief of the Queen's Heart Institute and the JABSOM Division of Cardiology, will provide additional administrative support. Both Drs. Banerjee and Khan are actively involved in research efforts in methamphetamine induced heart failure.

The Queen's Heart Institute will be partnering with the Queen's Care Coalition (QCC). QCC is led by Dr. Daniel Cheng and Tiffany Mukai. They have had significant success in their current roles, which includes managing a team of patient navigators. QCC works with patients who are some of the highest utilizers of The Queen's Medical Center and also patients self-identifying as Native Hawaiian with a social determinant of health need. Recent data from QCC patients 2020-2022 show that emergency department visits decreased by 60% when comparing 6 months pre-intervention and 6-months post-intervention. QCC provides harm reduction focused, culturally sensitive, and relationship-centered care.


