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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE ON AGING ADMINISTRATIVE CLAIMING SPECIAL FUND.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to clarify the  
2 allowable revenues to be deposited into the executive office on  
3 aging administrative claiming special fund.

4 SECTION 2. Section 349-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
5 amended to read as follows:

6 "[+]§349-5.5[+] Executive office on aging administrative  
7 claiming special fund. (a) There is established in the state  
8 treasury the executive office on aging administrative claiming  
9 special fund into which shall be deposited:

10 (1) All revenues from medicaid administrative claiming  
11 designated for the department of health that are  
12 allowable for operating the aging and disability  
13 resource centers[+] and programs within the executive  
14 office on aging;

15 (2) Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund;  
16 and

17 (3) Grants and gifts made to the fund.



1 (b) The executive office on aging administrative claiming  
2 special fund shall be administered and expended by the  
3 department of health to administer and implement [~~section 349-32~~  
4 ~~fer~~] services for kupuna and individuals with disabilities who  
5 need long-term services and supports."

6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.




