HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION TO OPEN A NEW PROCEEDING RELATING TO THE REMOVAL OF ABANDONED OR DOUBLE UTILITY POLES, LINES, AND EQUIPMENT.

WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission regulates all 1 chartered, franchised, certificated, and registered public 2 3 utility companies operating in the State; and 4 WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission's administrative 5 6 rules adopted the 2002 edition of the National Electrical Safety 7 Code as it pertains to the installation, operation, and maintenance of overhead and underground electrical supply and 8 9 communication lines; and 10 WHEREAS, the 2002 edition of the National Electrical Safety 11 Code states that "[1] ines and equipment permanently abandoned 12 shall be removed or maintained in a safe condition"; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, Hawaiian Electric Company, Inc. (Hawaiian Electric) is a utility company in the State that provides 16 electric services via lines using wooden poles within existing 17 county and state street rights-of-way to residential communities 18 19 and businesses; and 20 WHEREAS, Hawaiian Electric owns over 120,000 utility poles 21 22 on the island of Oahu; and 23 24 WHEREAS, when a new utility pole is installed adjacent to 25 an existing utility pole for the purpose of transferring electric, telephone, cable, or other wires from one pole to 26 another, the original pole is often left in place, resulting in 27 28 what is referred to as double poles; and 29

1 WHEREAS, there are thousands of derelict utility poles, double poles, and utility lines abandoned across Hawaii 2 neighborhoods; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the derelict utility and communication lines, abandoned utility poles, and redundant double poles should be 6 removed in a timely manner due to their growing threat to public 7 8 safety; and 9 WHEREAS, the removal of unnecessary and unsightly derelict 10 lines and poles will eliminate potential public hazards, 11 organize communication and utility pole lines, and favorably 12 13 influence the surrounding community; now, therefore, 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 16 17 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Public Utilities Commission is urged to open a new proceeding relating 18 to the removal of abandoned lines, double poles, and equipment; 19 20 and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Public Utilities Commission is requested to submit a status report of the new proceeding to 23 the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening 24 of the Regular Session of 2024; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 27 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Commissioners of the 28 Public Utilities Commission and President and Chief Executive 29 Officer of Hawaiian Electric Company, Inc. 30
