# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINORS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 346-17.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By amending subsection (e) to read:
- 4 "(e) Any provider who renders emergency shelter and
- 5 related services to a minor pursuant to subsections (a) and (b)
- 6 [of this section] and can demonstrate compliance with this
- 7 section shall be immune from any civil or criminal liability
- 8 based on the provider's determination to provide the shelter and
- 9 related services; provided that if a provider's assessment and
- 10 determination, or conduct in providing emergency shelter and
- 11 related services, is the result of the provider's gross
- 12 negligence or wilful or wanton acts or omissions, the provider
- 13 may be held liable for the provider's gross negligence or wilful
- 14 or wanton acts or omissions."
- 15 2. By amending subsection (h) to read:
- "(h) For purposes of this section:
- 17 "Minor" means a person less than eighteen years of age.



1 "No cost emergency shelter and related services" means 2 accommodation at no cost for a continuous period of no more than 3 thirty days, unless extended for emergency purposes and in 4 compliance with subsection (b), including beds, meals, individual showering facilities, transportation to and from the 5 6 place of shelter, and any of the following services as deemed 7 appropriate by the provider: (1) Assistance with reunification with the family, legal 8 9 quardian, or legal custodian of the minor; Referral to safe housing; 10 (2) 11 Individual, family, and group counseling; (3) Assistance in obtaining clothing; 12 (4)13 Access to medical and dental care, and mental health (5) 14 counseling; 15 (6) Education and employment services; 16 (7) Recreational activities; 17 Case management, advocacy, and referral services; (8) 18 (9) Independent living skills training; and 19 (10)Aftercare services, as those services are defined in 20 title 45 Code of Federal Regulations section 1351.1.

- 2 [and shall be repealed on June 30, 2023; provided that-section
- 3 346-17.6, Hawaii Revised-Statutes, shall be reenacted in the
- 4 form in which it read on the day before the effective date of
- 5 this Act]."
- 6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31,
- 9 2050.

### Report Title:

Department of Human Services; Emergency Shelter; Minors; Consent; Providers

### Description:

Requires providers of no-cost emergency shelter and related services to maintain separation for unrelated adults and minor children. Makes permanent the amendments to the definition of "provider" to include organizations that are not child placing organizations or child caring institutions that meet certain criteria. Effective 12/31/2050. (SD1)
