### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATIONAL HEALTH SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that all medication

2 requests to be administered by school health assistants are

3 currently reviewed and must be approved by Hawaii department of

4 health public health nurses. This process ensures that a health

5 care professional has reviewed the medication request and

6 determined that it is safe and appropriate for a student to

7 receive treatment. For example, some medications would be best

8 administered before or after school and other medications may

9 not be allowed if a school health assistant is not qualified to

10 assess the need for as-needed medication. Medication

11 administration is part of the medication management process and

12 requires clinical supervision by a health care professional,

13 including a registered nurse, advanced practice registered

14 nurse, physician assistant, or physician, to ensure the health

15 and safety of students if unlicensed assistive personnel, such

16 as school health assistants, are utilized.

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1	The legislature also finds that some schools have a
2	registered nurse, advanced practice registered nurse, or other
3	specialized health care provider on campus through written
4	agreements with the department of education. Partnerships with
5	federally qualified health centers and the University of Hawaii
6	at Manoa school of nursing have greatly improved access to
7	health services for students at school and through telehealth.
8	Student care would be more efficient, accessible, and safe if
9	the administration of the medication could be performed with the
10	approval of a health care professional within the department of
11	education, department of health, or a health care service per a
12	written agreement with the department of education. Existing
13	law prevents health care professionals who are already on campus
14	or in the school community from performing the function of
15	medication approval.
16	The purpose of this Act is to:
17	(1) Allow administration of medications by school health
18	assistants at school with the approval of a health
19	care professional within the department of education,
20	department of health, or health care service per a

written agreement with the department of education;

1	(2) Match the existing department of education practice	
2	for administration of medication at schools; and	
3	(3) Update the term "school health aides" to "school	
4	health assistants" to reflect updated job titles at	
5	the department of education.	
6	SECTION 2. Section 88-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
7	amended by amending the definition of "year round school	
8	employee" to read as follows:	
9	""Year round school employee": any teacher, school	
10	administrator, school health [aide,] assistant, educational	
11	assistant, school security attendant, or other salaried ten-	
12	month department of education employee working in a public	
13	school operating under a single-track restructured instructional	
14	schedule."	
15	SECTION 3. Section 302A-708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
16	amended to read as follows:	
17	"[{]§302A-708 Career development opportunities.[{]] The	
18	department of education shall provide career pathways	
19	development and training opportunities to all school health	
20	[aides] assistants in the school health services field and other	
21	fields within the department of education to ensure the	

1 opportunity for continued employment with the department of 2 education." 3 SECTION 4. Section 302A-853, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "§302A-853 Administration of medication. (a) 6 health [aides] assistants may assist students by administering 7 oral, nasal, and topical medication, and in emergency situations, other premeasured medication[+], including but not 8 9 limited to auto-injectable epinephrine for anaphylaxis, 10 bronchodilators for asthma, and seizure rescue medication for 11 seizure disorders; provided that: 12 If the student receiving the medication is a minor, a (1) parent or quardian requests and authorizes the 13 administration of medication; 14 15 (2) The medication has been prescribed by a licensed physician, as defined in section 334-1, or by a 16 17 practitioner with prescriptive authority; The administration of the medication is with the 18 (3) 19 approval of [the department of health; and] a health 20 care professional within the department of education, 21 department of health, or health care service as

10	SECTION 5. Section 302A-854, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
11	amended to read as follows:

13	compensation. All full-time school health [aides] assistants			
14	employed i	employed in the department shall be employed and have their		
15	compensation fixed in accordance with chapter 76 and the			
16	appropriat	appropriate collective bargaining agreement, executive order,

18	SECTI	ION 6. Section 457-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
19	amended to	amended to read as follows:

21	(1)	The furnishing of nursing assistance in an emergency;

2		program of study engaged in by students enrolled in
3		nursing education programs accredited by the board;
4	(3)	The practice of nursing under a nonrenewable permit

7		(B) An applicant who has provided proof that the
8		applicant has completed the entire educational
9		curriculum required for graduation for a nursing
10		license from,
11		a school that is in or under the jurisdiction of the
12		United States, a territory, or a foreign jurisdiction
13		and whose accreditation is recognized by the board;
14		provided that following completion of (A) or (B), the
15		candidate takes the first licensing examination
16		scheduled by any board of nursing recognized by the
17		board and has submitted to the board an application
18		for a license to practice nursing in the State; [and]
19		provided further that the permit shall be valid for
20		three months or until the results of the licensing

examination are received by the board;

Educational Health Services; Medication Administration; School Health Assistants; Exceptions

### Description:

Allows the administration of medication to public school students by health assistants with the approval of a health care professional within the Department of Education, Department of Health, or a health care service per a written agreement with the Department of Education. Replaces the term "school health aides" with "school health assistants" to reflect recent changes to the job title. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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
