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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PSYCHOLOGY INTERJURISDICTIONAL COMPACT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. (a) There is established a working group to  
2 study the feasibility and effects of the State adopting the  
3 Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact. The study shall  
4 include:

5           (1) The beneficial impact of the compact;

6           (2) The implementation and administration of the compact,  
7 including whether:

8           (A) Disciplinary actions for remote compact  
9 practitioners are possible under existing laws  
10 and by what means; and

11           (B) Compact authorized psychologists would be subject  
12 to reimbursement or liability insurance; and

13           (3) The economic feasibility of adopting the compact,  
14 including whether insurance coverage for remote  
15 practitioners is possible through compact  
16 authorization.



1 (b) The working group shall be composed of the following  
2 members:

3 (1) One member of the department of commerce and consumer  
4 affairs, who shall serve as chair;

5 (2) One member of the United States Department of Defense-  
6 State Liaison Office;

7 (3) One member of the senate, to be selected by the  
8 president of the senate;

9 (4) One member of the house of representatives, to be  
10 selected by the speaker of the house of  
11 representatives;

12 (5) One member of the board of psychology;

13 (6) One member of the public, to be selected by the  
14 president of the senate;

15 (7) One member of the public, to be selected by the  
16 speaker of the house of representatives;

17 (8) One member who is a licensed psychologist or a  
18 representative of the Hawaii Psychological  
19 Association; and

20 (9) One member of the Council of State Governments.



1 (c) The working group shall submit a report of its  
2 findings and recommendations, including any proposed  
3 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior  
4 to the convening of the regular session of 2024.

5 (d) The members of the working group shall serve without  
6 compensation.

7 (e) The working group shall be dissolved on July 1, 2024.

8 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
