A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE
NINTH SENATORIAL DISTRICT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The director of finance is authorized to issue
2 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$86,830,757 or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2023-2024
5 for the purpose of capital improvement projects for the ninth
6 senatorial district, as follows:

7 1. Aina Haina Elementary

5 SECTION 2. The appropriations made for the capital
6 improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
7 the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriations are
8 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriations that are
9 unencumbered as of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.

10 SECTION 3. The sums appropriated for the respective
11 capital projects set forth in section 1 shall be expended by the
12 designated expending agency for the purposes of this Act as
13 follows:

14 (1) The sums appropriated in items 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9,
15 and 11 shall be expended by the department of
16 education;

17 (2) The sums appropriated in item 2 shall be expended by
18 the department of land and natural resources; and

19 (3) The sum appropriated in item 10 shall be expended by
20 the University of Hawaii.



1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
