A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPECIAL ACTIVITY PERMITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 187A-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 3 "(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, the
- 4 department may issue permits, not longer than one year in
- 5 duration, to any person to take aquatic life $[-\tau]$; possess or use
- 6 fishing gear[7]; or engage in any feeding, watching, or other
- 7 such non-consumptive activity related to aquatic resources,
- 8 otherwise prohibited by law, in any part of the State, for
- 9 scientific, educational, management, or propagation purposes,
- 10 subject to chapter 195D and subject to those restrictions the
- 11 department deems desirable [-]; provided that the department
- shall approve or deny an application for the permit within
- 13 ninety days from the date that the application was submitted.
- 14 The department may revoke any permit for any infraction of the
- 15 terms and conditions of the permit. Any person whose permit has
- 16 been revoked shall not be eligible to apply for another permit
- 17 until the expiration of one year from the date of revocation."

- 1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
- 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 5 2024-2025 for two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions
- 6 within the division of aquatic resources to support the special
- 7 activity permit review process.
- 8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 9 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Description:

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to approve or deny an application for a special activity permit for aquatic research within ninety days from the date that it was submitted. Appropriates funds for two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions within the Division of Aquatic Resources to support the special activity permit review process. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
