SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STRONGLY URGING THE SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES TO ADOPT A FORMAL ETHICS CODE FOR THE JUSTICES.

WHEREAS, the disclosure of conflicts of interest and 1 potential or perceived conflicts of interest are important to 2 promoting openness, transparency, and trust in our judicial 3 4 system; and 5 WHEREAS, in Caperton v. A. T. Massey Coal Co., 556 U.S. 868 6 (2009), Justice Kennedy, writing for the court, stated that, 7 "[judicial] codes of conduct serve to maintain the integrity of 8 the judiciary and the rule of law"; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Code of Conduct for United States Judges is a 11 set of ethical principles and guidelines adopted by the Judicial 12 Conference of the United States and includes specific rules 13 about ethics, integrity, and appearances of impropriety relating 14 to outside business and political activities and the acceptance 15 of gifts; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, the Code of Conduct for United States Judges applies to federal circuit judges, district judges, Court of 19 International Trade judges, Court of Federal Claims judges, 20 bankruptcy judges, and magistrate judges; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the Judicial Conference of the United States, which promulgated the Code of Conduct for United States Judges, 24 does not have the authority to bind the Supreme Court of the 25 26 United States; and 27 WHEREAS, the nine justices of the Supreme Court of the 28 29 United States are not bound by any code of conduct; and 30 31 WHEREAS, on February 3, 2022, leading legal ethics scholars sent a letter to Chief Justice Roberts requesting that he draft 32

a formal ethics code for the Supreme Court of the United States; 1 2 now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 5 House of Representatives concurring, that the Supreme Court of 6 7 the United States is strongly urged to adopt a code of ethics similar to the Code of Conduct for United States Judges; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chief Justice of the 11 Supreme Court of the United States and members of Hawai'i's 12 congressional delegation. 13 14 Hal Rhand 15 16
