SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S OFFICE OF LANGUAGE ACCESS TO ESTABLISH AN AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETER WORKFORCE WORKING GROUP TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETERS IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, American Sign Language (ASL) is a distinct
language with its own cultural heritage and language rules and
structure; and

5 WHEREAS, ASL interpreters provide a critical service to 6 deaf, hard of hearing, deaf-blind, and hearing individuals and 7 public agencies in the State who wish to effectively communicate 8 with each other in a variety of settings and circumstances; and 9

10 WHEREAS, the Disability and Communication Access Board 11 notes there is an increased need statewide for communication 12 access provided by ASL interpreters, as reflected in the number 13 of requests made to local interpreter referral agencies; and 14

15 WHEREAS, despite the increase in requests for ASL 16 interpreting services, there is increased difficulty in the 17 recruitment of individuals who are qualified to serve as ASL 18 interpreters; and

20 WHEREAS, to provide greater accessibility for individuals 21 to receive ASL interpretation services in the State during 22 emergencies and daily life activities, there is a critical need 23 to develop an ASL interpreter workforce; now, therefore, 24

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Health's Office of Language Access is requested to convene an American Sign Language Interpreter Workforce Working Group for the purpose of promoting the increase of American Sign Language interpreters in the State; and
