SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S OFFICE OF LANGUAGE ACCESS
TO ESTABLISH AN AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETER
WORKFORCE WORKING GROUP TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF AMERICAN
SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETERS IN THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, American Sign Language (ASL) is a distinct
2 language with its own cultural heritage and language rules and
3 structure; and
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5 WHEREAS, ASL interpreters provide a critical service to
6 deaf, hard of hearing, deaf-blind, and hearing individuals and
7 public agencies in the State who wish to effectively communicate
8 with each other in a variety of settings and circumstances; and
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10 WHEREAS, the Disability and Communication Access Board
11 notes there is an increased need statewide for communication
12 access provided by ASL interpreters, as reflected in the number
13 of requests made to local interpreter referral agencies; and
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15 WHEREAS, despite the increase in requests for ASL
16 interpreting services, there is increased difficulty in the
17 recruitment of individuals who are qualified to serve as ASL
18 interpreters; and
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20 WHEREAS, to provide greater accessibility for individuals
21 to receive ASL interpretation services in the State during
22 emergencies and daily life activities, there is a critical need
23 to develop an ASL interpreter workforce; now, therefore,
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25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second
26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the
27 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
28 Health's Office of Language Access is requested to convene an
29 American Sign Language Interpreter Workforce Working Group for
30 the purpose of promoting the increase of American Sign Language
31 interpreters in the State; and



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to recommend training and incentives to increase the number of ASL interpreters in the State; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group's membership include the following members:

- (1) A representative from the Department of Health Office of Language Access who shall serve as chairperson of the working group;
- (2) A representative from the Department of Education;
- (3) A representative from the Department of Human Services Division of Vocational Rehabilitation;
- (4) A member of the Deaf and Blind Task Force;
- (5) A professor from the University of Hawaii who teaches ASL;
- (6) A senator selected by the President of the Senate;
- (7) A representative selected by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- (8) An individual who currently serves as an ASL interpreter; and
- (9) Additional representatives invited by the chairperson of the working group; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group, with the administrative assistance of the Department of Health, is requested to submit an interim report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024 and a final report no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2026; and




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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested

10 Deaf and Blind Task Force.
