SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WORKING GROUP TO EVALUATE NEW ZEALAND'S MODEL OF DECRIMINALIZING PROSTITUTION AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON HOW TO AMEND HAWAII LAWS TO DECRIMINALIZE PROSTITUTION.

WHEREAS, prostitution is currently illegal in Hawaii; and 1 2 3 WHEREAS, there is a growing body of research suggesting 4 that the decriminalization of prostitution could provide benefits to sex workers, their clients, and the broader 5 community; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, New Zealand is one of the few countries that has decriminalized prostitution, with the passage of the 9 Prostitution Reform Act 2003; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the New Zealand model has been in place for almost 12 twenty years, and there is a significant body of research on its 13 effects on sex workers, their clients, and the broader 14 15 community; and 16 WHEREAS, the Legislature would benefit from a thorough 17 18 evaluation of the New Zealand model and its potential application to Hawaii; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 21 22 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Provost of the 23 24 University of Hawaii at Manoa is requested to designate a faculty member of the Department of Women, Gender, and Sexual 25 26 Studies of the University of Hawaii at Manoa College of Social Sciences to establish a working group to evaluate New Zealand's 27 28 model of decriminalizing prostitution and make recommendations on how to amend Hawaii laws to decriminalize prostitution; and 29 30
