SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS TO RELOCATE ALL LIVE FIRE TRAINING AND AVIATION ACTIVITY AWAY FROM PUULOA RANGE TRAINING FACILITY.

1 WHEREAS, the facility now known as Puuloa Range Training 2 Facility was transferred from the United States Army to the United States Navy between 1915 and 1916; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, during the Vietnam era, the facility supported long-range sniper training until the training was moved in 1979 6 to what is now called Marine Corps Base Hawaii, in Kaneohe; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, after the sniper training exercises were relocated to Kaneohe, Iroquois Point was connected to Ewa Beach via an 10 access road mauka of the training facility, allowing TheBus to 11 service Iroquois Point; and 12 13 WHEREAS, in 2011, the Marine Corps doubled the length of 14 Puuloa Range Training Facility's Alpha Range, the range closest 15 to the Ewa Beach community, and re-established sniper training 16 17 at the facility, without seeking community input or conducting 18 an environmental assessment; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the expansion of the range and reinstatement of sniper training forced the closure of the access road and 21 22 termination of TheBus service to Iroquois Point, eliminating a 23 tsunami evacuation route; and 24 WHEREAS, since the reinstatement of sniper training at 25 Puuloa Range Training Facility, the facility's public address 26 system and shooting exercises have prompted hundreds of noise 27 complaints from the surrounding community; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the United States Marine Corps recently announced 30 that Puuloa Range Training Facility will be used as a night 31 landing zone for the Marine Corps' helicopters, which will 32

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significantly increase noise pollution outside of the facility's 1 regular hours; and 2 3 WHEREAS, persistent noise pollution, like that experienced 4 by residents who live near the training facility, can cause 5 hearing loss; increase the risk of miscarriages or low birth 6 weight; and cause or exacerbate cardiovascular disease, type two 7 8 diabetes, sleep disturbances, mental health impairments, childhood learning delays, and other health, developmental, and 9 behavioral issues; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the open-air ranges at Puuloa Range Training 12 13 Facility also create the risk of a stray bullet, ricochet, or an 14 accidental weapons discharge impacting nearby schools, churches, 15 homes, and parks; and 16 17 WHEREAS, in 2020, range gunfire was mistaken for an active shooter situation, causing lockdowns at nearby schools; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, environmental studies of the area surrounding Puuloa Range Training Facility have shown lead contamination 21 that is more than seventy times the legal limit; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, environmental studies have also found that there is a high risk of munitions constituents, materials originating 25 from unexploded ordnance, migrating to nearshore waters, 26 27 adjacent parks, and nearby homes; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands recently 30 announced the planned construction of approximately six hundred homes for native Hawaiians on land directly adjacent to the 31 32 Puuloa Range Training Facility; and 33 34 WHEREAS, the native Hawaiian families who reside in these 35 homes will disproportionately bear the risks of noise pollution, environmental pollution, and the possibility of stray gunfire 36 unless the United States Marine Corps relocates shooting 37 exercises and aviation activity and carries out environmental 38 remediation; and 39 40 WHEREAS, the First Responder Campus in Mililani and Camp 41 Blaz sniper training facility on Guam are currently under 42

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construction, offering possible alternatives for military and 1 non-military training; and 2 3 WHEREAS, alternatively, the United States Marine Corps 4 could relocate sniper training to Marine Corps Base Hawaii, as 5 it did in 1979; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the United States Marine Corps' plan to move four 9 of Puuloa Range Training Facility's firing ranges inland to help mitigate coastal erosion does not adequately address the 10 community's concerns about environmental harm, noise pollution, 11 12 and the dangers associated with the facility's open-air ranges; now, therefore, 13 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 16 17 that the United States Marine Corps is urged to relocate all live fire training and aviation activity away from Puuloa Range 18 19 Training Facility; and 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 21 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Secretary of Defense, Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration, Commandant 23 24 of the Marine Corps, Commander of the United States Marine Corps Forces Pacific, Commander of the Indo-Pacific Command, Commander 25 of the Naval Facilities Engineering Command Pacific, Commanding 26 27 General of the Marine Installations Pacific, Commander of Marine 28 Corps Base Hawaii, members of Hawaii's congressional delegation, 29 Governor, Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, Director of Health, Director of the Office of 30 31 Planning and Sustainable Development, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, and Chairperson of the Honolulu City 32 Council. 33
