SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO PREPARE AND DEVELOP SOLUTIONS AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION OF NURSES TO ADDRESS THE SHORTAGE OF THE NURSING AND HEALTH CARE WORKFORCE IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the State has historically had a shortage of health care workers, which was exacerbated by the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic that has pushed the State's health care system to its breaking point; and

WHEREAS, nurses, nurse aides, and other health care workers who directly care for and support patients at hospitals and care homes have continued to provide high quality care despite the incredible challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, often at significant personal costs to themselves; and

WHEREAS, health care workers faced high levels of stress and job turnover before the COVID-19 pandemic began, which were greatly exacerbated by the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, improving nurse and health care worker safety and working conditions leads to better patient care and staffing standards, such as minimum staff-to-patient ratios, adequate break and overtime protections, and hospital staffing plans, should be collaboratively developed by interested stakeholders to allow the health care system to better serve patients and Hawaii's communities; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, that the Department of Health is requested to convene a working group to prepare and develop solutions and make recommendations for the recruitment and retention of nurses to address the shortage of the nursing and health care workforce in the State; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to examine and make recommendations regarding the following
