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SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO ISSUE LOANS OR GRANTS TO BUYERS IN HIGH PRIORITY HOUSING CATEGORIES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO BUYERS WITH INCOMES ABOVE SIXTY AND AT OR BELOW ONE HUNDRED FORTY PERCENT OF THE MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME FOR THE STATE, OWNER-OCCUPANTS WHO OWN NO OTHER REAL PROPERTY, INDIVIDUALS ON THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS WAITLIST, AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.

WHEREAS, the State is experiencing a severe housing crisis; and

WHEREAS, a 2019 study commissioned by the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism found that the State will require an additional 50,156 homes by the year 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Home Loan Corporation, more commonly known as Freddie Mac, reported that the average thirty-year fixed residential mortgage interest rate rose from 3.11 percent in December 2021 to 6.42 percent in December 2022; and

WHEREAS, this two hundred six percent increase in the average thirty-year fixed residential mortgage interest rate reflects the dramatically increasing monthly cost of owning a home in the State; and

WHEREAS, home loans or grants made to eligible homebuyers could help counteract these higher interest rates and lower the effective borrowing interest rate; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, that the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation is urged to issue loans or grants to buyers in high priority housing categories, including but not limited to:
