SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO SUBMIT A REPORT TO
THE LEGISLATURE DETAILING THE DEPARTMENT'S PROCESS IN
ASSISTING INMATES IN OBTAINING IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

1 WHEREAS, the Legislature has been working to facilitate the
2 reentry of returning citizens back to their families and
3 communities after exiting incarceration; and
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5 WHEREAS, past legislatures have appropriated funds to the
6 Department of Public Safety to start the process of reentry by
7 ensuring that everyone who is released from incarceration has a
8 valid identification card; and
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10 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is transitioning
11 to a rehabilitative and therapeutic model; and
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13 WHEREAS, ensuring that persons exiting incarceration are
14 released with a valid identification card will facilitate their
15 reentry; and
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17 WHEREAS, the use of public funds allocated for ensuring
18 that each person is released from incarceration with a valid
19 identification card should be public information; and
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21 WHEREAS, in 2016, the Legislature appropriated \$25,000 to
22 the Department of Public safety for the purpose of creating
23 identification cards for inmates; and
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25 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety encountered
26 problems with the implementation of the 2016 program; and
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28 WHEREAS, in 2022 the Legislature appropriated \$100,000 to
29 the Department of Public Safety to purchase machines for data
30 input at each facility to implement the identification card
31 program; now, therefore,
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33 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second
34 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023,
35 that the Department of Public Safety is requested to submit a



1 report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
2 convening of the Regular Session of 2024 detailing the
3 Department's process in assisting inmates in obtaining
4 identification cards; and

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6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report is requested to
7 include:

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9 (1) The number of persons released since identification
10 cards became available in 2022, or since the
11 Department of Public Safety began assisting inmates in
12 obtaining civil identification cards;
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14 (2) The number of people released with an identification
15 card that was obtained with the Department of Public
16 Safety's assistance;
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18 (3) The number of people who received a free
19 identification card;
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21 (4) The number of people who were charged for a valid
22 identification card and the reasons for the charge;
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24 (5) Any charges assessed for a valid identification card;
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26 (6) The criteria necessary to obtain a valid
27 identification card; and
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29 (7) An accounting of the funding used to provide
30 assistance in obtaining valid identification cards;
31 and
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33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety
34 is requested to:

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36 (1) Post the report on the Department's publicly available
37 website; and
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39 (2) Provide a copy of the report to the Hawaii
40 Correctional System Oversight Commission so that the
41 Commission may post the report on its publicly
42 available website; and



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Director of Public Safety; Chairperson of the Hawaii Correctional System Oversight Commission; Chair of the Senate Committee on Public Safety, Intergovernmental, and Military Affairs; and Chair of the House of Representatives Committee on Corrections, Military, and Veterans.
