<u>HB 193, HD1</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY-EFFICIENCY PORTFOLIO	EET, CPN/WAM
(SSCR1317)	STANDARDS. Extends the State's energy-efficiency portfolio standards from	
<u>Status &</u> Testimony	2030 to 2045. Authorizes the public utilities commission to establish interim goals. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	

HB 197, HD1 (SSCR1238) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION. Requires the department of health to establish a refrigerant management program to reduce emissions of high global warming potential refrigerants and any refrigerant that is an ozone depleting substance from stationary, commercial, and industrial refrigeration systems and air conditioning systems and adopt rules for the regulation of the use of such refrigerants. Requires the state building code council to establish codes and standards consistent with the goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions associated with hydrofluorocarbons when updating the state building code. Specifies that no law, rule, ordinance, or code, including the state building code, shall prohibit or limit the use of a refrigerant deemed acceptable under federal law. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	AEN, CPN/WAM
HB 1134, HD2 (SSCR1211) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO KANEOHE BAY. Prohibits commercial ocean use activity in Kaneohe Bay waters without a permit. Prohibits any person from advertising any commercial ocean use activity in Kaneohe Bay waters for which the person does not have a permit. Establishes enforcement mechanisms for the prohibitions. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD2)	WTL, CPN/WAM
