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HB 961, HD1 (HSCR67) Status	RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING. Appropriates funds for the preschool open doors program and executive office on early learning to expand access to preschool and to implement program changes required by previous acts. Expands the types of entities from which a preschool open doors service provider may obtain accreditation. Expands the preschool open doors program application process to eligible three-year-old children. Authorizes the preschool open doors special fund to accept federal funds. Effective 6/30/3000. <u>HB 936</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, requires the Department of Education to include the teaching of financial literacy in the personal transition plan requirement for each student.	EDN, FIN



HB 744 Status	RELATING TO BOOSTER CLUBS. Requires school booster clubs to be audited by the department of education's internal audit office or department of accounting and general services on a regular basis. Requires the audited school booster club to reimburse the costs of the audit.	EDN, FIN
HB 77, HD1 (HSCR195) Status	RELATING TO TEACHERS. Clarifies that public charter school teachers and other personnel employed by public charter schools under the same pay schedule are included in collective bargaining unit (5). Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)	LGO, EDN, FIN
HB 1043 Status	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. Repeals the Department of Education's weekly report on schools that have reported positive COVID-19 cases.	EDN
<u>HB 1047</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Changes the Department of Education's quarterly report on autism spectrum disorder to an annual report.	EDN
<u>HB 262, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR292)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Provides a process for school placement for a child whose parent has transferred or is pending transfer from another state to a military installation in Hawaii while on active military duty pursuant to an official military order. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)	CMV, EDN
