Authorizes the safe routes for people implementation committee to develop the application process under the safe routes to school program. Renames the safe routes to school program special fund to the safe routes for people special fund and amends its purpose. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	TRN, FIN
