SB 1588 SD2 HD1 - RELATING TO FOOD SAFETY

Chair Yamashita, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and Members of the House Committee on Finance:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in <u>support</u> of SB 1588 SD2 HD1 relating to food safety. This bill is of great interest to the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources (CTAHR), as we are actively involved in the food safety education of Hawai'i's agricultural producers.

Since its passage in 2011, the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) is transforming the nation's food safety system by shifting the focus from responding to foodborne illness to preventing it. The GroupGAP program was created in 2015 to assist small farms with attaining their Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) certification. As a result of this congressional action CTAHR Cooperative Extension has been deeply engaged in educational efforts to actively provide agricultural producers the information and tools necessary to comply with current FSMA requirements.

The GroupGAP certification is the only comprehensive farm food safety training program in Hawai'i that results in U. S. Department of Agriculture Harmonized GAP certification that is the standard most closely aligned with the Food and Drug Administration's food safety guidelines.

CTAHR's work in this area is confined to education and we have Extension agents in each county of the state who assist agriculture producers in their preparation to pass the GroupGAP certification process. Land Grant universities do not certify agriculture producers for federally mandated programs such as GroupGAP. Likewise, pesticide applicator licenses are issued by the Hawai'i Department of Agriculture (HDOA), not CTAHR Cooperative Extension. CTAHR Cooperative Extension can help producers prepare for those certifications, but we cannot be the certifying organization.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in <u>support</u> of this measure and we defer to HDOA for 1) the logistics to establish and implement the GroupGAP food safety training and certification program, and 2) the allocation of funds to the entities capable to facilitate the GroupGap certification program for Hawai'i.

> SENATE BILL NO. 1588 SD2 HD1 RELATING TO FOOD SAFETY

Chairperson Yamashita and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill 1588 SD2 HD1. This bill appropriates funds to the Department of Agriculture (DOA) to establish and implement a GroupGAP food safety training and certification program. The DOA supports this bill and offers comments.

The DOA has a cooperative agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) that allows the DOA, pursuant to licensing by USDA, to conduct food safety audits for Hawaii farmers statewide, on a fee-for-service basis. Adding and consolidating Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) or GroupGAP training for farmers to the DOA's regulatory compliance responsibilities may create a potential conflict of interest if the training is also conducted by the same Departmental staff involved in administering the USDA GroupGAP certification program. Combining both the auditing and training programs in the Department could compromise the independence and objectivity of the food safety certification program's audits. It is highly advisable that the educational functions of the program be segregated from the enforcement and auditing functions to mitigate the risks presented by arrangement. As such, the DOA supports



this bill which provides appropriation placed under the budget of the DOA's Chairperson (AGR 192 General Administration for Agriculture) to establish and implement a GroupGAP training and certification program. This would separate funding for education from the funding for enforcement by the Quality Assurance Division.

The DOA notes that UH-CTAHR Cooperative Extension Service has a farm food safety program to educate and train Hawaii farmers to comply with federal food safety regulations. Their Extension Agents work with farmers statewide and they have the technical expertise in FSMA Produce Safety Rule and USDA GAP food safety regulations to educate and train farmers. UH-CTAHR does not currently handle GroupGAP training for farmers but may consider expanding or working with organizations that currently offer GroupGAP training, should there be funds to support this type of training statewide.

Dear Chair Yamashita, Vice-Chair Kitagawa, and members of the Committee:

On behalf of the North Shore Economic Vitality Partnership (North Shore EVP), I would like to extend strong support for SB1588 SD2 HD1, which appropriates funds for the establishment of a GroupGAP food safety training and certification program.

Food safety certification of Hawaii farms is a critical first step toward FSMA compliance and may lead to increased market access and opportunities to increase production for these farmers. The United States Department of Agriculture created the GroupGAP program in 2015 to assist small farms with attaining Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) certification. GroupGAP reduces the cost of food safety certification by spreading the training, technical assistance, and auditing costs between all farms in the group. Hawai'i GroupGAP is the only comprehensive farm food safety training program in Hawai'i that results in USDA Harmonized GAP certification, the standard most closely aligned with the Food and Drug Administration's FSMA food safety guidelines and is often required by larger commercial and institutional buyers.

Your committee passed HB1350, the companion bill to this measure in February. Since then, North Shore EVP started another Hawaii GroupGAP cohort of nine (9) farms and for the first time, had to turn farmers seeking food safety certification away.

While we now have GroupGAP farms in every county, the need to scale the program is greater than ever. Passing this bill will help ensure Hawaii's farmers access to the hands-on technical assistance and training they need to attain USDA Harmonized GAP certification.

My name is Micah Munekata, and I am the Director of Government Affairs at Ulupono Initiative. We are a Hawai'i-focused impact investment firm that strives to improve the quality of life throughout the islands by helping our communities become more resilient and self-sufficient through locally produced food, renewable energy and clean transportation choices, and better management of freshwater resources.

Ulupono <u>supports</u> SB 1588 SD2 HD1, which appropriates funds to the Department of Agriculture to establish and implement a GroupGAP food safety training and certification program.

Ulupono supports food safety certification training across the state for small- to mediumsized famers. According to the 2017 USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) Census of Agriculture, of Hawai'i's 7,328 farms statewide, 66%, or 4,868 farms, are between 1–9 acres and 78%, or 5,701 farms, produce less than \$25,000 in sales. Hawai'i's agricultural producer majority is small farmers. Many of these small farmers struggle to enter the marketplace, which is heavily driven by food safety compliance. Working off of such tight profit margins, local farmers are in need of support to meet grocer and food distributor demands such as food safety. Measures such as this seek to provide local producers with an opportunity to earn the necessary certifications in order to provide communities with fresh, Hawai'i-grown products.

Aloha Chair Yamashita, Vice-Chair Kitagawa, and Members of the Committee:

I am Brian Miyamoto, Executive Director of the Hawai'i Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,800 farm family members statewide and serves as Hawai'i's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic, and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

The Hawai `i Farm Bureau supports SB 1588, SD2, HD1, which appropriates funds to the Department of Agriculture to establish and implement a GroupGAP food safety training and certification program.

HFB appreciates the support of the legislature in our past efforts to help Hawai'i's farmers achieve food safety certification required by businesses that purchase local produce. Foodborne illnesses can be serious, and we should seek ways to reduce risk. The many criteria associated with food safety certification should not impede safe food. Hawai'i cannot afford to further lose farmers as we strive to increase local food production. We want to incentivize our farmers' ability to continue their operations and provide Hawai'i with abundant safe food. This bill will assist Hawai'i's small farmers with the costs they will incur to become food safety compliant.

USDA GroupGAP is gaining momentum across the nation as a resource for smaller-sized operations that need food safety certification and is the perfect mechanism for Hawai'i's small farmers because it provides a system of shared costs and a supportive network within a group of producers seeking certification. In Hawai'i, many small and mid-scale producers can use food safety certification to gain market access but are still hindered by challenges including individual audit costs and staff to manage the operation's food safety practices, writing a food safety plan, etc. GroupGAP alleviates those burdens by providing technical assistance, in essence, a food safety manager to guide practices and assist with documentation, and because producers share the costs of auditing across all farms in the group.

We support funding to provide training and support for a USDA GroupGAP program to increase the number of food safety-certified farmers.

Since 2014 I have operated the first and largest vertical farm in Hawaii. We strongly support this measure to enhance food safety support services for farmers in the state. Aloha Chair Yamashita, Vice-Chair Kitagawa, and members of the Committee:

Hawaii Fish Company, established in 1978, is an integrated aquaculture and aquaponics farm on the North Shore of Oahu. We have been participating in the Hawaii GroupGAP food safety training and certification program since 2021 and were the first aquaponics farm in the state to be GroupGAP food safety certified. My family, employees, and I strongly support SB 1588 SD2 HD1 and the appropriation of funds to establish a GroupGAP food safety training and certification program in the Department of Agriculture (DOA).

We pursued the GroupGAP certification as a more cost-effective and supported means to obtain food safety certification, with dedicated, well informed food safety specialists for training, to oversee complex recordkeeping requirements, and for periodic audit inspections. This has prepared our farm to meet the FDA/FSMA and USDA recordkeeping and audit requirements with an efficient online recordkeeping app, the posting appropriate signage, and employee training in proper food handling and storage requirements.

As FSMA becomes mandatory for most farms and the food supply chain, consumer and market demand for food safety certified produce will become the norm. Market opportunities for farmers without such certification will be greatly reduced. To help meet this increasing demand for food safety certified foods, it is critical that the DOA establish a GroupGAP food safety training and certification program.

Hawai'i's agricultural supply chain is in a precarious position. We rely on imports from the mainland to feed our families. Furthermore, the thousands of small farms in Hawai'i struggle to provide even a subsistence level of output for their local communities as large corporate farms dominate production. Finally, regulations like the FDA Food Safety Modernization Act increase the barriers our small farms must overcome to access institutional markets and scale beyond survival.

Beyond the obvious economic imperative to provide a path to growth for our small farms, Good Agriculture Practices (GAP) certification adds risk management and traceability into this critical pillar of our food supply chain. Implementing GAP reduces the risk of foodborne illness. In cases where contaminated products sicken our community; GAP certified producers are better able to participate in recalls and identify root causes. Furthermore, GAP certification is increasingly a prerequisite for small farms to supply the large, institutional wholesalers that can help them to expand. By expanding this mechanism for Hawai'i's small farms to engage the institutional supply chain, we increase opportunity and improve the safety of the food we consume every day.

SB1588 is a robust win-win for our community. It offers tangible and measurable economic benefits, while improving the supply chain's ability to deliver safe food to our tables. Furthermore, The North Shore Economic Vitality Partnership (North Shore EVP), an established leader in agricultural food safety in Hawai'i, is already leading the charge to assist growing small farms obtain GAP certification.
