**REPORT ON THE NUMBER OF PEN REGISTER ORDERS  
AND ORDERS FOR TRAP AND TRACE DEVICES  
APPLIED FOR BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES OF THE STATE**

Pursuant to Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes

Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that "[t]he attorney general, at least twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session, shall annually report to the legislature on the number of pen register orders and orders for trap and trace devices applied for by law enforcement agencies of the State."

According to the reports submitted by the law enforcement agencies of the State, from December 16, 2022, to August 8, 2023, none of the agencies applied for an order for a pen register, an order for a pen register extension, an order for a trap and trace, or an order for a trap and trace extension.
