12 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
13 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
14 that the appropriations contained in this Act will cause the
15 state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
16 to be exceeded by \$ or per cent. The reasons for
17 exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
18 appropriations made in this Act are necessary to serve the
19 public interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act.



1 SECTION 3. The sums appropriated for the respective
2 capital projects set forth in section 1 shall be expended by the
3 department of education for the purposes of this Act.
