
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WORKING GROUP TO DISCUSS
AGRICULTURE-RELATED ISSUES.

1 WHEREAS, agricultural crimes, including theft, vandalism,
2 and trespassing, are a persistent issue affecting Hawaii farmers
3 and ranchers; and
4

5 WHEREAS, according to a 2020 publication by the United
6 States Department of Agriculture and Hawaii Department of
7 Agriculture, there were nearly nineteen thousand incidents of
8 theft, vandalism, and trespassing on Hawaii farms in 2019; and
9

10 WHEREAS, these incidents cost Hawaii farms approximately
11 \$14,400,000, or ten percent of the estimated 2018 Hawaii net
12 farm income, in theft and vandalism losses and security costs;
13 and

15 WHEREAS, people often trespass onto Hawaii's farms and
16 ranches to illegally hunt; and
17

18 WHEREAS, these trespassers, who are often armed with
19 weapons and accompanied by dogs, can be particularly dangerous
20 and destructive for farming operations and can even result in
21 injury to or loss of life of landowners, farm or ranch
22 operators, and hunters; and
23

24 WHEREAS, reports have emerged regarding destroyed crops,
25 lost livestock, illegal drug use, litter, and discarded animal
26 carcasses on farm property; and
27

28 WHEREAS, despite the prevalence and cost of agricultural
29 crimes, many incidents go unreported and few result in
30 convictions; and

1 WHEREAS, of the nearly nineteen thousand incidents in 2019,
2 only nine hundred seventy incidents were reported to law
3 enforcement, which resulted in seventy-nine arrests and
4 sixty-seven convictions; and

5
6 WHEREAS, greater protections are needed to prevent illegal
7 hunting on Hawaii's farms and ranches without infringing upon
8 cultural hunting practices; now, therefore,

9
10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
11 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
12 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that a working group is
13 requested to be convened to discuss the parameters for
14 legislation that will protect Hawaii's farmers and ranchers from
15 unscrupulous hunters on their property while still protecting
16 the cultural practices of hunters; and

17
18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Speaker of the House of
19 Representatives is requested to appoint the member of House
20 District 46 to serve as chairperson of the working group; and

21
22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
23 to consist of a member of the Senate, to be appointed by the
24 President of the Senate, and representatives from the following
25 entities:

27 (1) United States Army Garrison Hawaii;

29 (2) Federal Aviation Administration;

31 (3) Department of Land and Natural Resources;

3 (10) Any other entity the chairperson of the working group
4 deems appropriate and invites to participate; and

5

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
7 to submit a report of its findings and recommendations,
8 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later
9 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session
10 of 2025; and

11

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature Reference
13 Bureau is requested to assist the working group in preparing its
14 report and any proposed legislation; provided that the working
15 group submits a draft of the working group's proposals to the
16 Legislative Reference Bureau no later than November 1, 2024; and

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
19 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Senior Commander of
20 the United States Army Garrison Hawaii, Administrator of the
21 Federal Aviation Administration, Chairperson of the Board of
22 Land and Natural Resources, Chairperson of the Board of
23 Agriculture, Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the Office
24 of Hawaiian Affairs, Speaker of the House of Representatives,
25 President of the Senate, Director of the Legislative Reference
26 Bureau, Chief of Police of the Honolulu Police Department,
27 President of the Pig Hunters Association of Oahu, President of
28 the Hawaii Cattlemen's Council, and President of the Hawaii Farm
29 Bureau.
