A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:
3 "**§286-102 Licensing.** (a) No person, except one:
4 (1) Exempted under section 286-105;
5 (2) Who holds an instruction permit under section 286-110;
6 (3) Who holds a limited purpose driver's license, limited
7 purpose provisional driver's license, or limited
8 purpose instruction permit under section 286-104.5;
9 (4) Who holds a provisional license under section
10 286-102.6;
11 (5) Who holds a commercial driver's license issued under
12 section 286-239; or
13 (6) Who holds a commercial driver's license instruction
14 permit issued under section 286-236,
15 shall operate any category of motor vehicles listed in this
16 section without first being appropriately examined and duly



1 licensed as a qualified driver of that category of motor
2 vehicles.

3 (b) A person operating the following category or
4 combination of categories of motor vehicles shall be examined as
5 provided in section 286-108 and duly licensed by the examiner of
6 drivers:

7 (1) Mopeds;

8 (2) Motorcycles, except for autocycles as described in
9 paragraph (2) of the definition of "motorcycle" in
10 section 286-2, and motor scooters;

11 (3) Passenger cars of any gross vehicle weight rating,
12 buses designed to transport fifteen or fewer
13 occupants, trucks and vans having a gross vehicle
14 weight rating of eighteen thousand pounds or less, and
15 autocycles as described in paragraph (2) of the
16 definition of "motorcycle" in section 286-2; and

17 (4) All of the motor vehicles in category (3) and any
18 vehicle that is not a commercial motor vehicle.

19 A school bus or van operator shall be properly licensed to
20 operate the category of vehicles that the operator operates as a
21 school bus or van and shall comply with the standards of the



1 department of transportation as provided by rules adopted
2 pursuant to section 286-181.

3 (c) No person shall receive a driver's license without
4 surrendering to the examiner of drivers all valid driver's
5 licenses and all valid identification cards in the person's
6 possession. All licenses and identification cards so
7 surrendered shall be shredded; provided that with the exception
8 of driver's licenses issued by any Canadian province, a foreign
9 driver's license may be returned to the owner after being
10 invalidated pursuant to issuance of a Hawaii license; provided
11 further that the examiner of drivers shall notify the authority
12 that issued the foreign license that the license has been
13 invalidated and returned because the owner is now licensed in
14 this State; and provided further that all commercial driver's
15 licenses that are surrendered shall be shredded. No person
16 shall be permitted to hold more than one valid driver's license
17 at any time.

18 (d) Before issuing a driver's license, the examiner of
19 drivers shall complete a check of the applicant's driving record
20 to determine whether the applicant is subject to any
21 disqualification under section 286-240, or any license



1 suspension, revocation, or cancellation, and whether the
2 applicant has a driver's license from more than one state or
3 jurisdiction. The record check shall include but is not limited
4 to the following:

- 5 (1) A check of the applicant's driving record as
6 maintained by the applicant's state or jurisdiction of
7 licensure;
- 8 (2) A check with the commercial driver license information
9 system;
- 10 (3) A check with the National Driver Register; and
- 11 (4) If the driver is renewing a commercial driver's
12 license for the first time after September 30, 2002, a
13 request for the applicant's complete driving record
14 from all states where the applicant was previously
15 licensed to drive any motor vehicle over the last ten
16 years; provided that a notation is made on the driving
17 record confirming the check has been made and the date
18 it was done.

19 (e) Beginning January 1, 2024, no person under the age of
20 sixty years shall receive a driver's license without providing
21 proof of cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification.



1 ~~(e)~~ (f) Notwithstanding sections 291E-61.6 and
2 291E-44.5, in addition to other qualifications and conditions by
3 or pursuant to this part, the right of an individual to hold a
4 motor vehicle operator's license or permit issued by the county
5 is subject to the requirements of section 576D-13.

6 Upon receipt of certification from the child support
7 enforcement agency pursuant to section 576D-13 that an obligor
8 or individual who owns or operates a motor vehicle is not in
9 compliance with an order of support as defined in section 576D-1
10 or has failed to comply with a subpoena or warrant relating to a
11 paternity or child support proceeding, the examiner of drivers
12 shall suspend the license and right to operate motor vehicles
13 and confiscate the license of the obligor. The examiner of
14 drivers shall not reinstate an obligor's or individual's license
15 until the child support enforcement agency, the office of child
16 support hearings, or the family court issues an authorization
17 that states the obligor or individual is in compliance with an
18 order of support or has complied with a subpoena or warrant
19 relating to a paternity or child support hearing.

20 The licensing authority may adopt rules pursuant to chapter
21 91 to implement and enforce the requirements of this section."



1 SECTION 2. Section 286-107, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:

3 "(e) No driver's license shall be renewed by the examiner
4 of drivers unless:

5 (1) The examiner of drivers is satisfied of the
6 applicant's fitness to continue to operate a motor
7 vehicle;

8 (2) The fee required by subsection (d) is tendered
9 together with the application for renewal;

10 (3) The applicant complies with section 286-102.5; [~~and~~]

11 (4) The examiner of drivers is satisfied that the
12 applicant does not have outstanding charges and fines
13 relating to the disposition of an abandoned
14 vehicle[-]; and

15 (5) Beginning January 1, 2024, an applicant who is younger
16 than sixty years of age provides proof of
17 cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification."

18 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
