A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE HEALTH PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT AGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 323D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted

 and to read as follows:
- ""Health care" means the improvement of a person's health
 through the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and amelioration
- 6 or cure of disease, illness, injury, or other physical and
- 7 mental impairment, regardless of the setting in which those
- 8 services are delivered."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 323D-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "§323D-12 Health planning and development functions; state 12 agency. (a) The state agency shall:
- 13 (1) Have as a principal function the responsibility for
 14 promoting [accessibility for all the people of the
 15 State to quality health care services at reasonable
 16 cost. The state agency shall conduct such studies and
 17 investigations as may be necessary as to the causes of

1		health care costs including inflation. The state
2		agency may contract for services to implement this
3		paragraph. The certificate of need program mandated
4		under part V shall serve this function. The state
5		agency shall promote the sharing of facilities or
6		services by health care providers whenever possible to
7		achieve economics and shall restrict unusual or
8		unusually costly services to individual facilities or
9		providers where appropriate; universal access to
10		high-quality, equitable, and affordable health care
11		for all the people of the State;
12	(2)	[Serve as staff to and provide technical assistance
13		and advice to the statewide council and the subarea
14		councils in the preparation, review, and revision of
15		the state health services and facilities plan;
16		Provide, throughout state government, leadership and
17		coordination of activities and resources that affect
18		health care access and quality, including health
19		insurance coverage rates, health insurance benefits,
20		affordability, workforce health, reimbursements,

1		quality, administrative simplification, workforce
2		development, and health information technology;
3	(3)	[Conduct the health planning activities of the State
4	,	in coordination with the subarea councils, implement
5		the state health services and facilities plan, and
6		determine the statewide health needs of the State
7		after consulting with the statewide council; and]
8		Establish a state health services, workforce, and
9		facilities plan and update that plan every four years
10		following consultation with the statewide health
11		coordinating council;
12	(4)	Administer the state certificate of need program
13		pursuant to part V[-], serving as staff to and
14		providing technical assistance and advice for the
15		statewide health coordinating council and subarea
16		health planning councils; and
17	(5)	Develop an annual state global budget based on total
18		costs of health care to:
19		(A) Prevent costs from rising faster than general
20		inflation; and
21	•	(B) Assure affordability of health care services;

1		provided that the plan shall be developed no later
2		than 2025 and shall be updated annually thereafter;
3		provided further that the plan shall be developed and
4		updated in consultation with the governor, department
5		of budget and finance, Hawaii employer-union health
6		benefits trust fund, and all public and private health
7		plans and providers of health insurance coverage.
8	(b)	The state agency may:
9	(1)	Prepare [such reports and recommendations]:
10		(A) Reports;
11		(B) Related health statistics as are needed to
12	•	monitor and improve health care access, outcomes,
13		equity, quality, costs, and cost-effectiveness;
14		and
15		(C) Recommendations,
16		on Hawaii's health care costs and public or private
17		efforts to reduce or control costs and improve health
18		care quality as [it] the state agency deems necessary.
19		[The] A report may include[, but not be limited to,] a
20		review of health insurance plans, the availability of
21		various kinds of health insurance and malpractice

1		insurance to consumers, and strategies for increasing
2		competition in the health insurance field[+] and
3		across the health care delivery system;
4	[(2)	Prepare and revise as necessary the state health
5		services and facilities plan.
6	(3)	Prepare, review, and revise the annual implementation
7		plan.
8	(4)]	(2) Assist the statewide council in the performance
9		of its functions[-];
10	[-(5) -]	(3) Determine the need for new health services
11		proposed to be offered within the State $[-]$;
12	[-(6) -]	(4) Assess existing health care services and
13		facilities to determine whether there are redundant,
14		excessive, or inappropriate services or facilities and
15		make public findings of any that are found to be so.
16		The state agency shall weigh the costs of the health
17		care services or facilities against the benefits the
18		services or facilities provide and there shall be a
19		negative presumption against marginal services $[-]$

1	$\left[\frac{(7)}{(5)}\right]$ Provide technical assistance to persons, public
2	or private, in obtaining and filling out the necessary
3	forms for the development of projects and programs $[-]$:
4	$[\frac{(8)}{(6)}]$ Prepare reports, studies, and recommendations on
5	emerging health issues, such as medical ethics, health
6	care rationing, involuntary care, care for the
7	indigent, and standards for research and development
8	of biotechnology [and], genetic engineering[-], remote
9	monitoring, artificial intelligence, and workforce
10	development; and
11	$[\frac{(9)}{(7)}]$ Conduct such other activities as are necessary to
12	meet the purposes of this chapter."
13	SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
14	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
15	37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
16	that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the
17	state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
18	to be exceeded by \$, or per cent. The reasons
19	for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
20	appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public
21	interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act.

1	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
4	administr	ative costs and to establish the following positions
5	within th	e state health planning and development agency:
6	(1)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) administrative
7		specialist IV position;
8	(2)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) research
9		statistician VI position, who shall serve as a state
10		healthcare informatician;
11	(3)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) research
12		statistician V position, who shall serve as an
13		administrative data specialist;
14	(4)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
15		VI position, who shall serve as a state health
16		planner;
17	(5)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
18		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
19		liaison for the county of Hawaii;

1	(6)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
2		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
3		liaison for the county of Kauai;
4	(7)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
5		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
6		liaison for the county of Maui; and
7	(8)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
8		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
9		liaison for the city and county of Honolulu.
10	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
11	health fo	r the purposes of this Act.

Report Title:

Department of Health; SHPDA; Positions; Appropriation; General Fund Expenditure Ceiling Exceeded

Description:

Amends the functions and duties of the State Health Planning and Development Agency. Appropriates moneys for administrative costs and to establish positions. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

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
