A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATED TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that emissions from
- 2 private vehicles account for twenty-eight per cent of all
- 3 greenhouse gas emissions in the country. The output of these
- 4 emissions peaks at normal commuting hours before and after the
- 5 workday. A key component to meeting the State's decarbonization
- 6 goals will be the reduction of vehicle miles travelled by
- 7 commuters, which can be done through several mechanisms,
- 8 including public transportation. Public transit produces
- 9 significantly less air pollution in comparison to a car carrying
- 10 one driver, and studies have shown that bus transit is sixty
- 11 times safer than driving.
- 12 The legislature further finds that opting for public
- 13 transit over private vehicles for commutes helps drivers save
- 14 money on fuel, insurance, parking, and vehicle maintenance
- 15 costs, which can reduce the cost of living for Hawaii residents.
- 16 The legislature also finds that the State has a
- 17 responsibility to lead in the decarbonization transition and



1	should encourage the utilization of public transportation that					
2	encourages fuel efficiency per passenger mile and contributes to					
3	an overall decrease in the necessary amount of energy for					
4	transportation.					
5	The purpose of this Act is to require the department of					
6	transportation to establish a state employee commuter benefits					
7	program.					
8	SECTION 2. Chapter 196, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
9	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated					
10	and to read as follows:					
11	"§196- State employee commuter benefits program. (a)					
12	The department of transportation shall establish a state					
13	employee commuter benefits program that consists of one or more					
14	of the following commuter benefits options:					
15	(1) A program, consistent with section 132(f) of the					
16	Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, allowing					
17	covered employees to elect to exclude from taxable					
18	wages costs incurred for transit passes, vanpool					
19	charges, and bicycle commuting costs up to the maximum					
20	amount allowed by federal tax law; or					

1	(2)	A program whereby the department offers state
2		employees a subsidy to offset the monthly cost of
3		commuting via transit, vanpool, or bicycle. The
4		subsidy shall be equal to the lesser of the monthly
5		cost of a transit pass or the monthly cost of a
6		vanpool; provided that a subsidy for bicycle costs
7		shall be in addition to subsidies for transit and
8		vanpool costs.
9	(b)	Nothing in this section shall prevent the department
10	of transp	ortation from offering a more generous commuter benefit
11	that is o	therwise consistent with the requirements of the
12	applicabl	e employee commuter benefits program. Nothing in this
13	section s	hall require employees to change their method of
14	commute.	
15	<u>(c)</u>	For purposes of this section:
16	<u>"Tra</u>	nsit pass" means any pass, token, fare card, voucher,
17	or simila	r item entitling a person to transportation on public
18	transit,	including but not limited to travel by bus or train.
19	"Van	pool" means any highway vehicle that:
20	(1)	Has the seating capacity of at least six adults, not
21		including the driver; and

1	(2)	<u>Is rea</u>	sonably expected to use at least eighty per cent
2		of the	mileage for the purpose of transporting a
3		number	of employees equal to at least fifty per cent
4		of the	seating capacity of the vehicle, not including
5		the dr	river, in connection with travel between the
6		reside	ence and place of employment of employees."
7	SECT	ION 3.	New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECT	ION 4.	This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
