Establishes a task force to develop and explore alternate routes into and out of the Waianae Coast, including through Kolekole pass and opening Waianae Coast emergency access road. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	TCA/PSM, WAM
<a href="#">HB 2295, HD1</a> <a href="#">(HSCR723-24)</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO THE TRAFFIC CODE. Authorizes stopping, standing, and parking restrictions and prohibitions on property under jurisdiction of the Director of Transportation and the counties, respectively. Specifies that the counties may issue traffic infractions for violations of any law prohibiting or restricting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on all highways and county property. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	TCA/PSM, JDC
