Update: Traffic Safety Improvements

The incident involving the McKinley High School student at the Kapi'olani-Kamake'e Street intersection was tragic and further reinforced the need to improve our roads to protect pedestrians and responsible drivers. Rep. Saiki has been working closely with the State Department of Transportation and the City Department of Transportation Services to make the following safety improvements:

- Speed humps have been installed on both sides of Kapi'olani Blvd.
- Red-light safety cameras have been installed and started issuing warnings on March 22.
- The State DOT is working on the designs for the raised crosswalk on Pensacola St. between King St. and Kapi'olani Blvd.

Annual Future Farmers of America Conference

Government Reform at the Legislature

In a pledge to increase transparency and accountability in state and county government, the House of Representatives introduced all the recommendations from the Commission to Improve Standards of Conduct (CISC) on ethics laws, campaign finance laws, and government reform. With the exception of five bills, all recommendations moved through the legislature, and several were transmitted to the Governor. On March 31st, 2023, Governor Josh Green signed seven "Good Government Bills" including five of the CISC recommendations.

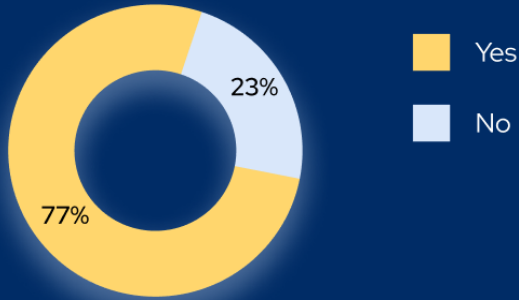


Cooke Street Sewer Repair Update

Construction crews are conducting repairs on make-shift islands in the middle of Cooke St., allowing for two-way traffic along the outside portions of the roadway. While the entrances and exits for parking lots in the area will remain unobstructed, there will be a temporary loss of street parking in the area during this phase of the project. Work is scheduled to take place Monday through Saturday, from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., until this phase of the project is done.

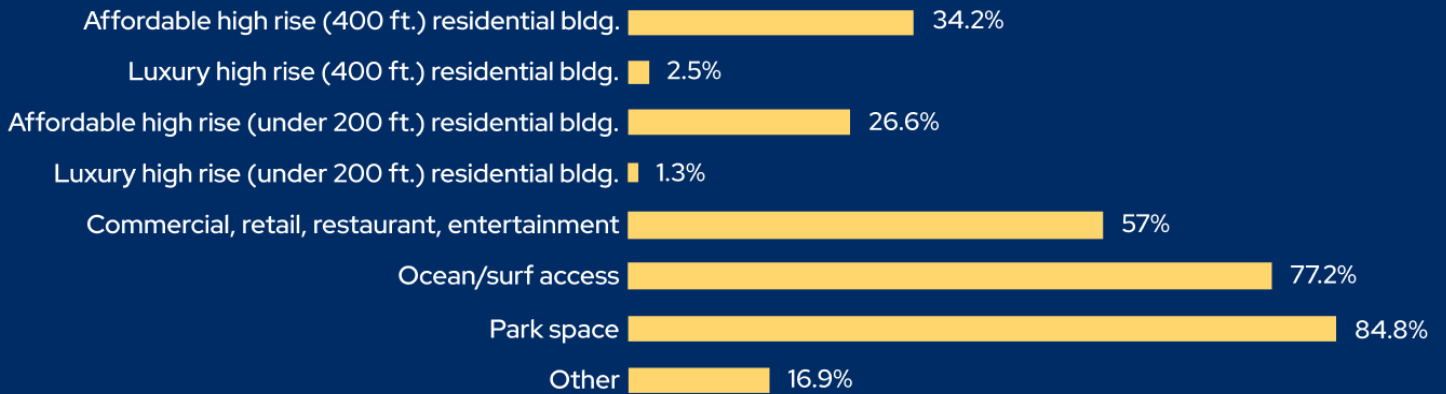

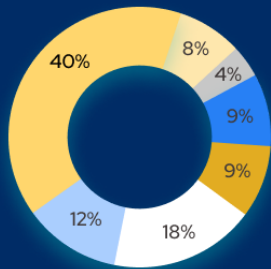
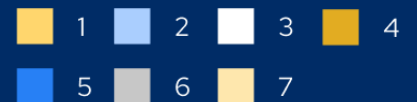

What kind of development do you support at Kaka'ako Makai?

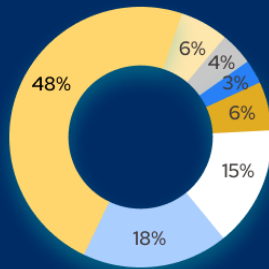
