

Recording: Condo Insurance Town Hall Recap

In response to the current surge in insurance premiums statewide, we're proposing a special fund inspired by a post-Hurricane Iniki initiative. With an estimated \$1 billion needed for full coverage of all buildings, our goal is to stabilize the situation while addressing underlying factors behind rising rates. While not a comprehensive solution, this fund aims to provide support and prevent uninsured buildings from facing potential challenges, such as being listed on banks' do-not-lend lists.

House Reaffirms Commitment to Protecting Marriage Equality

On March 5, the House of Representatives reaffirmed its commitment to protecting marriage equality. HB 2802 HD1 passed its third reading, proposing a constitutional amendment to eliminate restrictions on same-sex marriage. Despite progress with the Hawai'i Marriage Equality Act in 2013, recent Supreme Court shifts have raised concerns that the Court could reconsider its stance on same-sex marriage, potentially undermining established rights for marriage equality. HB2802 HD1 aims to remove Article I, Section 23, from the State of Hawaii Constitution, challenging the Legislature's authority to limit marriage.




Kokua Column: Sheridan Street

Our office received a call on March 8 about homelessness along Sheridan Street, near Walmart. Taking swift action, we conducted a site visit, and the encampment appears to have diminished since the last report. Though smaller, we've reported the situation to the 311 app and the C.O.R.E. program. While this area has been flagged in the past, it seems the issue has resurfaced, prompting us to stay vigilant in reporting and seeking resources for those in need.

Kolowalu Makai Park Updates

Exciting news! The construction of Kolowalu Makai Park has begun. This is in addition to the off-leash dog park under construction on the Mauka park and the crosswalk improvements. We received the following updates from the Hawaii Community Development Authority (HCDA):

- Ten new park benches located around the children's playground area were installed and initial feedback is people loved them.
- Three new picnic tables will be installed on the Diamond head side of the park under the threes to allow families to enjoy a meal.
- Adult fitness equipment will be installed in the back corner of the Makai park allowing adults to exercise while watching their children play in the park. The location of the adult fitness equipment in the back corner of the park activates the part of the park.
- The existing playground equipment will be replaced with new equipment.
- New playground equipment for younger children (age 5 and under) will also be installed.



The crosswalk at Queen St. and Waimanu St. is being upgraded with rectangular rapid flashing beacons. Watch out for sidewalk closures from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, now through May 2024. Pedestrians are advised to observe posted signage.
