MAUI HIGH SCHOOL RECOGNIZED AS SCHOOL OF DEMOCRACY






What does Kahului, Pu'unene, and Wailuku need more of? 1 = We do not need more of this in our community

2024 BIPARTISAN MAUI WILDFIRE PACKAGE

Relating to Distribution Management

HD1

HB1835 Establishes the distribution management advisory board to develop and advise on the state distribution management plan.

HB1837 HD1

Relating to School Safety

Requires the Department of Education to grant public access to emergency action plans and have school evacuation plans.

Relating to the Environment

HB1839 Appropriates funds for long term monitoring of air and water quality and supports environmental research efforts.

HCR4

Northwest Wildfire Protection

Request Hawai'i's congressional delegation to amend the wildland fire protection agreement allowing Hawai'i to join.

HCR3

Emergency Zoning

Urges each county to establish an emergency zoning code for post-disaster use.



Relating to Health

HB1836

Allows pharmacists to refill prescriptions and devices for a thirty-day supply during declared states of emergency.

HB1838 HD1

Relating to Zoning

Allows counties to enact zoning ordinances to phase out non-conforming single family vacation and rental units over time.

HB1840 HD1

Relating to the Environment

Appropriates funds to the Department of Land and Natural Resources for water quality monitoring and pollution detection.

HB1842

Relating to Fire Prevention

Increases the maximum fine for violations of the fire protection laws including offense classification and criminal penalties.

HB1841 HD1

Dept of Land and Natural Resources

Appropriates funds towards equipment, positions, & wildfire emergency response.



KEY LEGISLATIVE ISSUES

KŪPUNA CAUCUS



Temporarily expands the state rent supplement program to specifically target qualified individuals who are sixty-two years of age or older and are homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless. Would require the Hawai'i Public Housing Authority (HPHA) to submit annual reports to the legislature. Attempts to establish a comprehensive, long-term system to ensure that low-income kūpuna are not forced into homelessness due to increased fixed costs over time.

HOUSING



HB1762 HD1Relating to Housing

Requires any government agency that exercises its authority to develop low or moderate income housing projects that meet established development requirements. No county shall adopt any rule or ordinance that imposes stricter income requirements than those adopted or established by the state.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT



HB2243 Relating to Capital Improvement Project

Allocated \$150,000,000 from the director of finance appropriated for the 2024-2025 fiscal year for capital improvement projects. Funding to be utilized for construction of a middle school in central Maui to be expended by the Department of Education.



CIVIL AIR PATROL



HB2241 HD1 Relating to Civil Air Patrol

For more than seventy-five years, the Civil Air Patrol has assisted emergency management agencies as a non-profit organization. Their emergency responses efforts include search and rescue, damage assessments, aerial photography and transportation of supplies. State funding ceased for a period of five years, and this initiative seeks to appropriate funds to continue these emergency support initiatives. The response of the Civil Air Patrol was instrumental in responding to the wildfire relief efforts in Lahaina.

EDUCATION



HB1653 HD1 Relating to Education

Once teacher salaries are adjusted for the cost of living, Hawai'i teachers are the lowest paid in the country. HB1653 HD1 calls to provide annual salary step increases for public school teachers and educational officers who have completed a year of satisfactory service and comply with specified requirements. This initiative will help retain qualified educators and incentivize stability in education by decreasing turnover.



HB1775 HD1 Relating to Education

Allocates funding for the 2024-2025 school year to require the Department of Education (DOE) to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students enrolled in DOE schools.
