On Thursday, March 5th, House bills crossed over to the Senate while Senate bills came to the House. As soon as Senate measures were assigned to House Standing Committees, committee hearings began and will continue throughout March.

Many of the bills that crossed over are part of the House and Senate package of Economic bills. These bills address the needs of working families. They include affordable housing, expanding child care and early learning, food, taxes, health care and transportation.

Count Us In... Everybody Matters!

Every ten years (at the beginning of the new decade), the U.S. Census Bureau, part of the U.S. Department of Commerce, conducts the Decennial Census. Census information is used to calculate the number of seats that each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives.


Your participation in the census is important to your community, county and state. Federal funds, grants and support to the state are based on population totals. When you respond to the census you will be helping your community to get your fair share of more than \$675 billion for schools, hospitals, roads and public works. The census also impacts programs that provide services to the elderly.

Every individual counts so please participate in the 2020 census. Each resident will receive a census letter from March $12^{th} - 20^{th}$. You will be able to self-respond using the internet starting March 12-23, 2020. From May – July, Census officials will begin visiting homes that haven't responded.

The final count will impact us all for the next ten years and together we can ensure that our state receives all the valuable resources it needs.


