2014 NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF STATE LEGISLATURES (NCSL) FORUM IN D.C.

Sen. English attended the NCSL Forum in Washington, D.C. from Dec. 9 - 12 to help build the States' Agenda and learn the latest on important state-federal issues. The Forum provides many opportunities for legislators. Since 1975, NCSL has helped states remain strong and independent by providing the tools, information and resources for crafting effective legislation. NCSL is committed to the success of legislators and staff by improving the quality and effectiveness of state legislatures; promoting policy innovation and communication and ensuring state legislatures a strong, cohesive voice in the federal system.

Among the topics discussed during the Forum were: State Implementation of Proposed EPA Greenhouse Gas Emissions Regulations; Transmission Development for a Changing Energy Grid; Gas Pipelines – Improving Safety and Reducing Emissions; Promising Practices in Women's Health; A Case Study of Vermont's GMO Labeling Law; Legalizing Industrial Hemp in the States; New Technologies in Agriculture; Military Mission Sustainability: A Community Perspective; Recent Reforms to the VA; Update from the U.S. Department of Defense; State Progress in Helping Seniors Live Independently and the Changing Role of Family Caregivers; Supporting Family Caregivers Through Workplace Flexibility and Helping Seniors Live Independently and with Dignity; Cyber Security - State Governments at Risk; Escalating Cyber Security Attacks; and Strategies for Safeguarding State Information Assets.



NATIONAL CAUCUS OF ENVIRONMENTAL LEGISLATORS (NCEL)

Sen. English attended the NCEL Washington D.C. summit at the White House focusing on trade, global warming and the Clean Power Plan on Dec. 9. NCEL was organized in 1996 with the purpose of providing environmentally progressive legislators an opportunity to coordinate their activities and share ideas on affirmative and negative environmental issues.

The goal of the NCEL is to organize pro-environment state legislators nation-wide and to educate them on state and federal environmental issues and policies resulting in the enactment of sound policy at the state level.

"I have always been a champion of the environment," said Sen. English, "NCEL provides legislators with the best information possible to advance new environmental initiatives and safeguard existing environmental policies as well as helping us communicate more effectively across state lines on nationwide trends."





HAWAII CONGRESSIONAL TALK STORY & TOUR - While Sen. English was in D.C. he met with members of the Hawai'i Congressional Delegation, which includes: U.S. Sen. Mazie K. Hirono and Sen. Brian E. Schatz; U.S. Rep. Tulsi Gabbard and Rep. Mark Takai.

These meetings provide Sen. English with an update on federal matters that impact the State of Hawai'i and its residents.

NCSL LEGISLATIVE LEADERS SYMPOSIUM IN NEW YORK CITY

Before returning to Hawai'i from the East Coast, Sen. English traveled to New York City for the NCSL Symposium for Legislative Leaders from Dec. 15 -17. As the new Senate Majority Leader, Sen. English will have new responsibilities and face many challenges.

"NCSL provides many resources to help legislators perform our duties in the most efficient and reliable manner in whatever capacity we serve," said Sen. English, "The symposium in New York was very helpful because the presentations were specific to those legislators in leadership positions."

During the 3 days, topics included: The Power of Likeable Leaders, Leadership and the Art of Power with Pulitzer Prize Author Jon Meacham, Effective Communications Strategies, Telling Your Story and Making Your Point, 2015 U.S. Economic Outlook and the 2015 NCSL Leaders Programs Preview. The Symposium closed with a roundtable discussion on State Budgets and the Federal Fiscal Landscape.
