



SB 2544 Establishes a college savings program income tax credit. 





beautification, amending the offense of theft to include reckless disregard of risk for the value of stolen property, allowing counties to place stricter limitations on passengers riding in a pickup truck, eliminating the need for a federal tax clearance certificate for temporary liquor licenses, and appropriating funds for an international study pilot program at the University of Hawaii.
