

Proposes an amendment to the Hawaii State Constitution to allow a recount of votes cast in an election be

Requires manual recounts of election votes when the margin of victory is equal to or less than one hundred votes

Enacts voting by mail uniformly statewide for all elections commencing with the 2020 primary. Establishes a limited number of voter service centers that would remain open from the tenth business day preceding an election through the day of the election to receive personal delivery of mail-in ballots, accommodate voters with special needs, and provide other election services. Allows for additional places of deposit for personal delivery of mail-in ballots. Appropriates funds for the implementation and administration of the election by mail program.


