Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this bill.¹ The Campaign Spending Commission ("Commission") supports this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to enhance Hawaii's partial public financing program by increasing the maximum amount of public funds available for all offices by 50% (except for the Office of Hawaiian Affairs ("OHA") which will be significantly enhanced by over 1,000%) to qualified candidates. It also makes a downward adjustment of the minimum qualifying contributions for certain offices because it appears that publicly financed candidates for those offices were having a difficult time raising the minimum qualifying contributions. Respectfully, the Commission is submitting this bill as an attempt to boost an existing program that is mandated by the State Constitution which has not changed and whose maximum dollar amounts have not changed since 1995.

This bill amends Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") sections as follows:

1) HRS §11-425 by increasing the maximum amount of public funds available for all offices (except for an OHA trustee) by 50% and increasing the maximum amount of public funds available for a candidate for trustee of OHA from \$1,500 for the election

period to 10% of the expenditure limit for each election established in HRS §11-423(d).

- 2) HRS §11-429(a) by increasing the amount of qualifying contributions required for a candidate for trustee of OHA from more than \$1,500 in the aggregate to more than \$5,000 in the aggregate.
- 3) HRS \$11-429(b) by increasing matching fund payments from \$1 for each \$1 of qualifying contributions in excess of the minimum qualifying contribution amounts to \$2 for each \$1 of excess qualifying contributions.

The bill also provides a downward adjustment of the minimum amounts of qualifying contributions for the office of prosecuting attorney for the city and county of Honolulu, and counties of Hawaii and Kauai, and for the office of county council for the county of Maui. Lastly, the bill establishes two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions in the Commission and appropriates funds.

For illustration, here is a comparison of the present partial public funding program in contrast to the enhanced partial public funding program set forth in this bill. For a qualified Senate candidate running in District 1 in the 2024 election, the maximum amount of public funds available is \$7,211 in the primary election and another \$7,211 in the general election. In contrast, under this bill, this same candidate would receive \$10,816 in the primary election and another \$10,816 in the general election. For a qualified House candidate running in District 1 in the 2024 election, the maximum amount of public funds available is \$3,485 in the primary election and another \$3,485 in the general election. In contrast, under this bill, this same candidate would receive \$5,227 in the primary election and \$5,227 in the general election. Lastly, for a qualified OHA candidate, the maximum amount of public funds available is \$1,500 for the election year. In contrast, under this bill, this same candidate would receive \$17,227 in the primary election and \$17,227 in the general election.

The Commission requests this Committee to restore the \$200,000 in funding in Section 6 of the bill for two additional positions to implement the expansion of the partial public financing program and to restore the effective date of July 1, 2024. The Commission requests that this committee pass this bill with amendments.

Testimony in Opposition of Hawaii House Bill HB1845

Statement of Position: This testimony is written to express strong opposition to **House Bill HB1845**, which pertains to increasing the amount of partial public campaign financing available for all elective offices. This bill could mean that my tax dollars could support a campaign that I do not support. This bill is unfair, ineffective, and wasteful.

Background Information: HB1845 aims to amend the Hawaii Revised Statutes to increase the amount of partial public campaign financing available for all elective offices, including the governor, the lieutenant governor, the state legislators, the county mayors, the county council members, and the county prosecutors. - HB1845 could violate the First Amendment rights of taxpayers, who have the right to free speech and association, and the right to refrain from supporting speech or association that they do not endorse.
- HB1845 could also create a conflict of interest for taxpayers, who may have different views or interests than the candidates or parties that receive public campaign financing.
- o HB1845 is unfair, as it could force taxpayers to fund campaigns that they do not support or agree with, and that may not represent their views or interests.

2. Ineffectiveness and Accountability:

- o HB1845 is ineffective, as it does not guarantee that candidates who receive public campaign financing will be more responsive or accountable to the public.
- o HB1845 does not require candidates who receive public campaign financing to abide by any additional ethical or performance standards, nor does it provide any mechanism for the public to monitor or evaluate their actions or outcomes.
- o HB1845 does not prevent candidates who receive public campaign financing from accepting private donations or spending their own money on their campaigns, which could still create the appearance or reality of corruption or influence.
- o HB1845 does not address the other factors that affect the outcome of elections, such as voter turnout, media coverage, incumbency, or party affiliation, which could still give an advantage or disadvantage to certain candidates or parties.
- o HB1845 is ineffective, as it does not guarantee that candidates who receive public campaign financing will be more responsive or accountable to the public, or that they will improve the quality or diversity of representation.

3. Wastefulness and Cost:

- o HB1845 is wasteful, as it would divert public funds from other essential services or programs that could benefit the people of Hawaii.
- HB1845 does not specify the source of funding for the public campaign financing program, nor does it provide any estimate of the cost or the demand for such funds.
- HB1845 does not consider the opportunity cost of spending public funds on the public campaign financing program, rather than on other services or programs that could address the needs or priorities of the people of Hawaii, such as education, health care, infrastructure, or environmental protection.
- HB1845 does not demonstrate any clear benefit or return on investment for the public campaign financing program, nor does it require any assessment or evaluation of the effectiveness or impact of the program.
- HB1845 is wasteful, as it would divert public funds from other essential services or programs that could benefit the people of Hawaii, without any clear benefit or accountability.

Conclusion: This testimony urges the legislature to reject HB1845. This bill is unfair, ineffective, and wasteful, as it would increase the amount of partial public campaign financing available for all elective offices. This bill could mean that my tax dollars could support a campaign that I do not support. This bill is unfair, as it could force taxpayers to fund campaigns that they do not support or agree with.
