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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OUT-OF-STATE PRESCRIPTIONS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that administrative rules  
 2 adopted by the board of pharmacy permit the transfer of  
 3 prescription information between pharmacies for the purpose of  
 4 initial prescription fill or refill dispensing. Furthermore, an  
 5 out-of-state practitioner may issue a written, oral, or  
 6 electronic prescription within the confines of the  
 7 practitioner's license and pursuant to Hawaii laws and rules.  
 8 Accordingly, it is permissible for a pharmacy in the State to  
 9 complete an initial prescription fill and any refills.

10 The legislature recognizes that it is common for an out-of-  
 11 state patient to require an acute medication, such as  
 12 antibiotics, while visiting the State. When an out-of-state  
 13 patient requires medication, the patient's out-of-state  
 14 practitioner issues the prescription to an out-of-state  
 15 pharmacy. Because Hawaii law does not explicitly permit out-of-  
 16 state pharmacies to transfer prescription information to in-  
 17 state pharmacies for dispensing an initial prescription fill,  
 18 local pharmacists must contact out-of-state practitioners for a



1 verbal order. This results in workflow redundancy and  
2 ultimately treatment delays for out-of-state patients.

3 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize out-  
4 of-state pharmacies to transfer prescription information for the  
5 initial fill of an out-of-state prescription in the State.

6 SECTION 2. Section 328-17.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
7 amended as follows:

8 1. By amending subsection (b) to read:

9 "(b) An out-of-state pharmacy may transfer prescription  
10 information for filling or refilling purposes and an out-of-  
11 state medical oxygen distributor may transfer prescription  
12 information for the purpose of refilling a medical oxygen  
13 order."

14 2. By amending subsection (d) to read:

15 "(d) Before filling or refilling a transferred out-of-  
16 state prescription, or before refilling medical oxygen, a  
17 pharmacist or medical oxygen distributor shall:

18 (1) Except as otherwise authorized for expedited partner  
19 therapy in section 453-52 or for an opioid antagonist  
20 in section 461-11.8, advise the person whose name  
21 appears on the prescription that the prescription on



1 file at the originating out-of-state pharmacy or  
2 medical oxygen distributor may be canceled; and

3 (2) Record all information required to be on a  
4 prescription, including:

5 (A) The date of issuance of the original  
6 prescription;

7 (B) The number of refills authorized on the original  
8 prescription;

9 (C) The date the original prescription was dispensed;

10 (D) The number of valid refills remaining and the  
11 date of the last refill;

12 (E) The out-of-state pharmacy's or out-of-state  
13 medical oxygen distributor's name, telephone  
14 number, and address, and the original  
15 prescription number or control number from which  
16 the prescription information was transferred; and

17 (F) The name of the transferor pharmacist or the  
18 medical oxygen distributor's agent."


19 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.


