A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the
2 Judiciary Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2024.

3 SECTION 2. Act 70, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, is amended
4 as follows:

5 1. By amending part II to read:

6 **"PART II. PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

7 SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may
8 be sufficient to accomplish the purposes and programs designated
9 herein, are appropriated or authorized from the sources of
10 funding specified to the judiciary for the fiscal biennium
11 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The total
12 expenditures and the number of permanent and temporary positions
13 established in each fiscal year of the fiscal biennium shall not
14 exceed the sums and the position ceilings indicated for each
15 year, except as provided in this Act.

11 SECTION 8. The [~~sum of \$20,955,000~~] sums appropriated or
12 authorized in part II of this Act for capital improvement
13 projects shall be expended by the judiciary for the projects
14 listed below; provided that several related or similar projects
15 may be combined into a single project, if a combination is
16 advantageous or convenient for implementation; provided further
17 that the total cost of the projects thus combined shall not
18 exceed the total of the sums specified for the projects
19 separately. The amount after each cost element and the total
20 funding for each project listed in this part are in thousands of
21 dollars.

8 SECTION 3. Act 38, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, as amended
9 by section 3 of Act 5, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, is amended
10 by amending section 7.1 to read as follows:

11 "SECTION 7.1. [~~(a) Beginning on the effective date of~~
12 ~~this Act the judiciary shall submit a weekly report to the~~
13 ~~legislature that includes the following information for all~~
14 ~~inmates released pursuant to supreme court orders entered in~~
15 ~~SCPW-20-0000200 and SCPW-20-0000213.~~

- 16 ~~(1) The inmate's name;~~
- 17 ~~(2) The inmate's release date;~~
- 18 ~~(3) The correctional center or facility where the inmate~~

- 20 ~~(4) The inmate's criminal status before release, for~~

15 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
 16 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
 17 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
 18 that the appropriations contained in this Act will cause the
 19 state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2023-2024
 20 to be exceeded by \$1,005,342,734, or 9.4 per cent. The reasons
 21 for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the



1 appropriations made in this Act are necessary to serve the
2 public interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act.

3 SECTION 5. If any portion of this Act or its application
4 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any
5 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall
6 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
7 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
8 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
9 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
10 extent possible.

11 SECTION 6. If any manifest clerical, typographical, or
12 other mechanical error is found in this Act, the chief justice
13 may correct the error. All changes made pursuant to this
14 section shall be reported to the legislature at its next regular
15 session.

16 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

18 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
