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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE FIRST RESPONDERS TECHNOLOGY CAMPUS AND  
CYBERSECURITY DATA CENTER.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The legislature finds that critical  
2 infrastructure for state and county first responders and data  
3 systems needs to be relocated. Many existing facilities are  
4 outdated and within the inundation zone, and agencies have  
5 outgrown their current footprint. Some agencies lack permanent  
6 headquarters, training facilities, and storage space and require  
7 the use of leased facilities, which should be invested in  
8 permanent assets that are owned and controlled by the State.

9           The legislature further finds that lands purchased by the  
10 Hawaii technology development corporation are dedicated for the  
11 first responders technology campus and cybersecurity data  
12 center. The first responders technology campus and  
13 cybersecurity data center is a major project involving federal,  
14 state, and county first responders and the office of enterprise  
15 technology services to co-locate headquarters and training  
16 facilities in central Oahu. Being outside of the inundation



1 zone, this new facility would provide critical partnerships for  
2 the State's first responders as they coordinate joint trainings  
3 and responses. The site is also near the only airfield outside  
4 of the inundation zone, as Hickam Air Force Base, Daniel K.  
5 Inouye International Airport, and Kalaeloa airport are near the  
6 shorelines. Moving and co-locating critical infrastructure  
7 outside of the inundation zone will provide a strategy for  
8 shoreline retreat and accommodation.

9 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii emergency  
10 management agency, Hawaii army national guard, department of  
11 land and natural resources, department of public safety, and  
12 department of law enforcement have committed to coordinate  
13 access to the first responders technology campus and  
14 cybersecurity data center, with federal agencies also expressing  
15 interest in the project.

16 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the issuance of  
17 general obligation bonds and appropriate bond funds for the  
18 development of the first responders technology campus and  
19 cybersecurity data center on tax map key (1) 9-5-002-057.

20 SECTION 2. The director of finance is authorized to issue  
21 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much



1 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof  
2 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2023-2024  
3 for the development of the first responders technology campus  
4 and cybersecurity data center on tax map key (1) 9-5-002-057.

5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii  
6 technology development corporation for the purposes of this Act.

7 SECTION 3. The appropriation made for the capital  
8 improvement project authorized by this Act shall not lapse at  
9 the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is  
10 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation  
11 unencumbered as of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.

12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
