A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VALUE-ADDED PRODUCTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that local food
- 2 production is integral to the State's economic development and
- 3 food security. The legislature recognizes that what the
- 4 department of health calls "homemade food products" is what most
- 5 states define as "cottage food". Cottage food, or homemade food
- 6 that is sold directly to consumers, is a small but growing
- 7 industry and is preferred among many consumers who are mindful
- 8 of responsible sourcing and healthy eating options and those who
- 9 want to support the local communities and individuals producing
- 10 the foods they consume.
- 11 The legislature further finds that there is great interest
- 12 in small-scale homemade food operations in the State, but the
- 13 existing regulatory framework creates several challenges for
- 14 entrepreneurs, including those in rural areas who do not have
- 15 access to commercial or certified kitchens or those who no
- 16 longer have access to commercial or certified kitchens. In
- 17 fact, Hawaii is one of only a few remaining states that does not

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- 1 provide certain exemptions from its department of health for
- 2 homemade food products. The legislature further recognizes that
- 3 expanding access to local homemade food products should require
- 4 the same food safety training and certification as that required
- 5 of other food establishments in the State.
- 6 The legislature further believes that permitting homemade
- 7 food operations in the State would grow small businesses; foster
- 8 innovation and economic growth; offer locally made alternatives
- 9 to imported brands; create local employment opportunities; keep
- 10 more money within the local economy; and increase tax revenues
- 11 to support the growing needs of the State, including ongoing
- 12 wildfire relief efforts. Notably, the legislature also believes
- 13 that implementing exemptions for small-scale homemade food
- 14 operations will provide a valuable opportunity for local
- 15 entrepreneurs to bring their homemade food products to market
- 16 and can serve as an essential lifeline for producers impacted by
- 17 the recent Maui wildfires.
- 18 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to expand
- 19 opportunities for producers and consumers of homemade food
- 20 products by requiring the department of health to:

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- (1) Amend the definition of "homemade food products" in
 the Hawaii Administrative Rules; and
- 3 (2) Adopt certain rules regarding the sale and delivery of
 4 homemade food products.
- 5 SECTION 2. No later than December 31, 2024, the department
- 6 of health shall amend the definition of "homemade food products"
- 7 under chapter 11-50, Hawaii Administrative Rules, pursuant to
- 8 chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to read as follows:
- 9 "Homemade food products" means non-temperature controlled
- 10 for safety (TCS) foods produced or packaged in a home kitchen
- 11 that have a pH of equal to or less than 4.6 and a water activity
- 12 value that is less than 0.88; provided that any homemade food
- 13 product containing chopped tomatoes, such as salsa, also must be
- 14 kept refrigerated at below forty-one degrees Fahrenheit. This
- 15 term includes pickled or fermented fruit or vegetable products,
- 16 except for cantaloupes and other fruit from the melon family.
- 17 SECTION 3. The department of health shall adopt rules
- 18 pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that allow
- 19 homemade food products to:
- 20 (1) Be sold by:

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1		(A)	The homemade food operator for direct sale to the
2			consumer, whether in person or remotely,
3			including by telephone or the Internet; or
4		(B)	An agent of the homemade food operator or a
5			third-party vendor, such as a retail shop or
6			grocery store, to the consumer; and
7	(2)	Be d	elivered to the consumer by:
8		(A)	The homemade food operator;
9		(B)	An agent of the homemade food operator or a
10			third-party vendor, such as a retail shop or
11			grocery store;
12		(C)	Mail; or
13		(D)	Shipping.
14	SECT	ION 4	. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
