
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT PLANNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to replace the
2 director of law enforcement with the director of corrections and
3 rehabilitation as a member of the Hawaii interagency council for
4 transit-oriented development. The director of public safety was
5 named as a member of the Hawaii interagency council for transit-
6 oriented development when it was established in 2016. In the
7 codification of Act 278, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, which
8 reorganized the department of public safety, section 226-64(a),
9 Hawaii Revised Statutes, was amended to replace the director of
10 public safety with the director of law enforcement. As the
11 council advises on state facilities in transit-oriented
12 development areas, the director of corrections and
13 rehabilitation, who has administrative responsibilities for
14 correctional and rehabilitation facilities statewide, is the
15 more appropriate director to serve on the transit-oriented
16 development council.

17 SECTION 2. Section 226-64, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

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1 "(a) The Hawaii interagency council for transit-oriented
2 development shall be composed of the following members:

3 (1) Director of the office of planning and sustainable
4 development, who shall serve as co-chair;

5 (2) Executive director of the Hawaii housing finance and
6 development corporation, who shall serve as co-chair;

7 (3) Chief of staff, office of the governor;

8 (4) Chairperson of the board of land and natural
9 resources;

10 (5) Director of transportation;

11 (6) Comptroller;

12 (7) Director of health;

13 (8) Director of human services;

14 (9) Director of [~~law enforcement;~~] corrections and
15 rehabilitation;

16 (10) Chairperson of the Hawaiian homes commission;

17 (11) Chairperson of the stadium authority;

18 (12) President of the University of Hawaii;

19 (13) Superintendent of education;

20 (14) Executive director of the Hawaii community development
21 authority;

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- 1 (15) Executive director of the Hawaii public housing
2 authority;
- 3 (16) One member of the house of representatives to be
4 designated by the speaker of the house of
5 representatives; provided that the speaker of the
6 house of representatives may designate a second member
7 of the house of representatives to serve as an
8 alternate;
- 9 (17) One member of the senate to be designated by the
10 president of the senate; provided that the president
11 of the senate may designate a second member of the
12 senate to serve as an alternate;
- 13 (18) The mayor of each county;
- 14 (19) A representative of the Honolulu field office of the
15 United States Department of Housing and Urban
16 Development, who shall be requested to serve on a
17 nonvoting[-], [+], ex officio basis by the governor;
- 18 (20) A representative of the business community, to be
19 designated by the governor;
- 20 (21) A representative of the community who is a housing
21 advocate, to be designated by the governor; and

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1 (22) A representative of the community with experience in
2 housing and real estate development, to be designated
3 by the governor."

4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Hawaii Interagency Council for Transit-Oriented Development

Description:

Amends the membership of the Hawaii Interagency Council for Transit-Oriented Development to replace the Director of Law Enforcement with the Director of Corrections and Rehabilitation.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Business, Economic Development, and Tourism

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT PLANNING.

PURPOSE: To replace the Director of Law Enforcement with the Director of Corrections and Rehabilitation as a member of the Hawaii Interagency Council for Transit-Oriented Development.

MEANS: Amend section 226-64(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION: The director of the Department of Public Safety was named as a member of the Hawaii Interagency Council for Transit-Oriented Development (TOD Council) when the TOD Council was established in 2016. Act 278, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2022, reorganized the Department of Public Safety (PSD) into two departments: the Department of Law Enforcement and the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation. In codifying Act 278, section 226-64(a) was amended to replace the Director of Public Safety with the Director of Law Enforcement. As the TOD Council advises on matters related to the planning and development of State facilities in transit-oriented development areas, the Director of Corrections and Rehabilitation, who has administrative responsibilities for correctional and rehabilitation facilities statewide, is the more appropriate director to serve on the TOD Council. The provisions related to the new Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation are to take effect on January 1, 2024.

Impact on the public: None.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
There is no impact on the department or other agencies, as PSD has continued to

serve and is active on the TOD Council. This bill will ensure that the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation remains involved in transit-oriented development planning and implementation statewide.
