A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that electric system
2	resilience should be a metric that the State monitors and
3	considers. Maintaining a resilient electric system is
4	especially important in Hawaii, given the State's geographical
5	isolation. The 2023 wildfires on Maui illustrated how
6	vulnerable the State is to natural and human-caused disasters.
7	It is critical that the State continue to prioritize actions
8	that ensure the electric system can rapidly recover.
9	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
10	(1) Establish system resilience as a metric that is
11	monitored and considered by the public utilities
12	commission; and
13	(2) Provide that the Hawaii electricity reliability
14	surcharge may be transferred to the commission for the
15	purpose of its duties.

1	SECTION 2. Section 269-141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted			
3	and to read as follows:			
4	""Resilience" means the ability of the Hawaii electric			
5	system and its components to adapt to changing conditions and to			
6	withstand and rapidly recover from severe disruptions."			
7	SECTION 3. Section 269-142, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
8	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:			
9	"(b) The commission may develop reliability standards and			
10	interconnection requirements as it determines necessary or upon			
11	recommendation from any entity, including an entity contracted			
12	by the commission to serve as the Hawaii electricity reliability			
13	administrator provided for under this part, for the continuing			
14	reliable design, resilience, and operation of the Hawaii			
15	electric system. Any reliability standard or interconnection			
16	requirement developed by the commission shall be adopted by the			
17	commission in accordance with subsection (a) in order to be			
18	effective. The commission shall not contract for the			
19	performance of the functions under this subsection to any other			
20	entity as provided under section 269-147."			

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- 1 SECTION 4. Section 269-143, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) The commission shall have the authority to monitor 4 the reliability, resilience, and operation of the Hawaii 5 electric system using any data, files, maps, reports, or any 6 other information concerning any electric utility, any user, 7 owner, or operator of the Hawaii electric system, or any person, business, or entity connecting to the Hawaii electric system, 9 considered by the commission to be necessary for ensuring the 10 reliable operation and resilience of the Hawaii electric system. 11 The authority of the commission to monitor information in this 12 section shall include the authority to request, acquire, or 13 otherwise accumulate real-time data on any matter the commission 14 deems necessary to monitor the reliable design, resilience, and 15 operation of the Hawaii electric system." 16 SECTION 5. Section 269-145.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 17
- 18 "\$269-145.5 Advanced grid modernization technology;
- 19 principles. (a) The commission, in carrying out its
- 20 responsibilities under this chapter, shall consider the value of
- 21 improving electrical generation, transmission, and distribution

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systems a	and infrastructure within the State through the use of
advanced	grid modernization technology in order to improve the
overall r	eliability, resilience, and operational efficiency of
the Hawai	i electric system.
(b)	In advancing the public interest, the commission shall
balance t	echnical, economic, environmental, and cultural
considera	tions associated with modernization of the electric
grid, bas	ed on principles that include but are not limited to:
(1)	Enabling a diverse portfolio of renewable energy
	resources;
(2)	Expanding options for customers to manage their energy
	use;
(3)	Maximizing interconnection of distributed generation
	to the State's electric grids on a cost-effective
	basis at non-discriminatory terms and at just and
	reasonable rates, while maintaining the reliability of
	the State's electric grids, and allowing such access
	and rates through applicable rules, orders, and
	tariffs as reviewed and approved by the commission;
(4)	Determining fair compensation for electric grid
	advanced overall r the Hawai (b) balance t considera grid, bas (1) (2)

services and other benefits provided to customers and

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1	for electric grid services and other benefits provided
2	by distributed generation customers and other
3	non-utility service providers; and
4	(5) Maintaining or enhancing grid reliability, resilience
5	and safety through modernization of the State's
6	electric grids."
7	SECTION 6. Section 269-146, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:
9	"(b) Amounts collected through the Hawaii electricity
10	reliability surcharge shall be transferred in whole or in part
11	to any entity contracted by the commission to act as the Hawaii
12	electricity reliability administrator provided for under this
13	part[-] and to the commission for the purpose of its duties
14	pursuant to sections 269-142, 269-143, and 269-144.
15	(c) The Hawaii electricity reliability surcharge shall be
16	used for the purposes of ensuring the reliable operation \underline{and}
17	resilience of the Hawaii electric system and overseeing grid
18	access on the Hawaii electric system through the activities of
19	the Hawaii electricity reliability administrator contracted
20	under section 269-147; provided that amounts collected under the

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- 1 Hawaii electricity reliability surcharge shall not be available
- 2 to meet any current or past general obligations of the State."
- 3 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
